STANDBY MECHANICAL ENGINEERING
AND ENERGY SUPPORT SERVICES (MULTIYEAR)

DeKalb County Government (the County) requests qualified individuals and firms with experience in providing Mechanical Engineering and Energy Support Services and Consultation, to maximize the efficiency of Facility Management HVAC Systems, Equipment, and Facility comfort and operational efficiency on an as requested basis. Respondents shall demonstrate the ability as a licensed mechanical engineering firm, to provide HVAC and DDC control consultation, manipulation, troubleshooting energy conservation alternatives and HVAC design support. Respondents are also expected to demonstrate their business practice and experience in integrating a complete sustainability, energy management and sustainability commissioning program.

I. INTRODUCTION

A. DeKalb County Government (the County) Department of Facilities Management is soliciting Request for Proposals (RFP) from qualified Mechanical Engineering firms knowledgeable in providing assessments of equipment conditions functionality and energy management, with the objective of insuring that the County has the ability to repair, replace or redesign as necessary any obsolete or inefficient systems. Consultant shall satisfactorily demonstrate significant experience in working with municipalities and/or governmental agencies in conducting on site visits & reviews of equipment; verifying and validating floorplans and equipment inventory and functionality; design, assessments, inspections, on a local area scale. Consultant must demonstrate the ability to meet the following minimum criteria to be considered responsive to the RFP.

B. The successful firm(s) will provide the above services and demonstrate the ability to meet the following minimum criteria to be considered responsive to the RFP:

The Proposer shall demonstrate knowledge, skills, abilities and experience in the following areas:

- 1.1 Proposer shall provide a Project Manager and Principle-in-Charge who has a minimum of five (5) years' experience providing Facilities Related Planning, Design, Engineering, and HVAC Assessment services.
- 1.2 Proposer shall provide a team directory showing each team member and include the following for each team member listed: firm name; corporate home office location; address, phone number and e-mail addresses.
- 1.3 Proposer shall provide an organizational chart which clearly indicates each discipline, company name, principal-in-charge, and project manager(s) assigned with the overall project coordination.
- 1.4 Proposer must have, at a minimum, five (5) years relevant experience conducting analysis or process

reviews for Professional Engineering Services related to Mechanical Engineering, and services for entities comparable in size and number of facilities, with DeKalb County in the past five (5) years.

- C. The following Required Documents Checklist includes a list of attachments which **must** be completed and returned with Responder’s technical proposal:

- D. The services shall commence within ten (10) calendar days after acknowledgement of receipt of written notice to proceed. This is a multiyear contract (expected 5 years) to be utilized on an, as, if and when needed basis. Completion dates will be scheduled in accordance with the work assigned and coordinated through the County’s Project Manager.
- E. The County anticipate multiple awards from at least one (1) to three (3) awardees.

II. STATEMENT OF WORK

The scope of services required by the County in connection with this request for proposal covers those services customarily provided to government entities by firms in the practice of rendering consulting services for Mechanical Engineering Services and Assessments. Work will vary based on the specific assignment and timing of the engagement. However, all work will be in the realm of Mechanical Engineering services. Any County Department or agency may engage the scope of work. DeKalb County intends to engage a Mechanical Engineering firm to provide technical, professional and other services for various DeKalb County projects as broadly described in this RFP. The intent of this project is for one firm to provide some, all or any combination of the various and diverse technical, professional, mechanical engineering planning projects, and related projects for the County on an as needed basis. Whenever services are requested by the County the Consultant will submit a written proposal for the specific project based on the scope of services requested. The County may accept or reject the proposal, or decline such services when it is in the best interest of the County to do so. If the Consultant's proposal is accepted, the County may issue a Work Authorization and Notice to Proceed that specifies the "not-to-exceed" dollar amount of the Work Authorization with the begin and completion date. After having received the Notice to Proceed, including a written approval of the scope of services and estimate of fees for a specific project, the Consultant shall provide the services required for the specific project in accordance with the contract and scope of service. The County may rescind a Notice to Proceed or Work Authorization at any time at the County's convenience if it is in the best interest of the DeKalb County. When a Notice to Proceed is rescinded, the County will pay the Consultant for any authorized work that has been satisfactorily performed up to, and through the date of cancellation. In the event of cancellation, the Consultant will not be entitled to any additional compensation for unauthorized work or anticipated lost profits due to such cancellation. All work products for which compensation is received by the Consultant from the County shall be submitted to the County, as the property of the County. Further, all authorized work shall be

submitted to the County before final payment is approved by the County. It is understood and agreed by the Consultant that services performed under the Scope of Services as stated in this RFP shall include, but not be limited to those services described below and to the extent desired by The County. Basic Services may include the provision of various professional services as hereinafter stated that include mechanical engineering, contract administration, prequalification, bidding, and construction inspection services incidental thereto. Services also include preparation of engineering studies, modeling process and hydraulics, energy analysis and assistance with regulatory requirements, citizen participation involvement, pre-design and pre-construction support and partnering. The County may request all, some, any combination of or none of the services identified in this Scope of Services. When the County desires any services contemplated under this RFP, the County will contact the Consultant and request a written proposal, estimate of costs and preliminary schedule for the work to be performed on each specific project based on the Scope of Services desired by the County. The following describes the varied tasks necessary to meet the requirements of this Request for Proposal:

- Onsite inspections to provide full assessment of equipment age and conditions;
- Providing specific technical expertise in enhancing equipment functionality and energy efficiency;
- Formulate a plan for facility improvements based on AABC Commissioning Group Standards for Retro-Commissioning.
- Create an engineering plan to reduce “customer complaints”, develop a strategy to improve client facility comfort and maintain set points in accordance with ASHRAE standards between 68-74 Degrees Fahrenheit;
- Provide Project Management for assigned equipment repairs, replacement or redesign;
- Make recommendation to improve (IAQ) Indoor Air Quality, in accordance with ASHRAE comfort and humidity standards for the Southeaster Continental United States.
- Conducting specific assessments under the supervision of the Construction Project Manager;

1. ENGINEERING STUDIES

Certain projects may be assigned to the Consultant that requires the only deliverable to be technical memorandums and/or final reports. Such projects will usually be for planning purposes or consist of an efficiency study. These projects will not require additional design, bids or construction services as outlined elsewhere in this document. Mechanical Engineering studies will require the use of engineering and scientific specialists proficient in the subject area of the project. These specialists will be considered local for billing purposes with no reimbursement for travel and lodging expenses. The Consultant will be required to maintain a project schedule and budget for each study assigned. A minimum of two (2) weeks shall be provided in the project schedule for County review of each deliverable unless otherwise directed by the County. Services may include, but not be limited to the following:

- 1.1 A kick-off meeting;
- 1.2 Progress meetings as determined by the County;
- 1.3 Information gathering;
- 1.4 Preparation of draft technical memorandums on specific subject areas of the project;
- 1.5 Review meetings and coordination of review comments;
- 1.6 Preparation of the final report; and
- 1.7 Presentation of the results at private and public forums when requested and directed by the County.

2. CONSULTATIVE, INVESTIGATIVE, RE-DESIGN AND PRE-DESIGN SERVICES

The Consultant may be requested to provide various services including, but not limited to, the following:

- 2.1 Inspections, explorations, surveys, testing or other services concerning the collection, analysis, evaluation and interpretation of data leading to specialized conclusions and recommendations;
- 2.2 Feasibility studies on proposed projects, including studies of clients' needs, analysis of conditions or methods of operation, development of alternative concepts, economic analyses, environmental studies and site location studies;
- 2.3 Development of preliminary design reports, including outline specifications, preliminary cost estimates; and
- 2.4 Schematic design and design development for revamping building equipment projects.

3. PROJECT MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The Consultant may be required to provide Project Management Services including, but not limited to the following:

- 3.1 Meeting the County requirements related to the project intent, quality, schedule and budget;
- 3.2 Assisting in the selection of consultants;
- 3.3 Performing conceptual studies including economic feasibility;
- 3.4 Planning, scheduling, monitoring, controlling, estimating, budgeting and cash control for specific projects;
- 3.5 Mechanical Engineering and design;
- 3.6 Installation management;
- 3.7 Commissioning testing and start-up of new facilities and or equipment;
- 3.8 Quality assurance;
- 3.9 Project closeout, energy improvements;
- 3.10 Maintaining a document tracking and control system through the duration of the project; and
- 3.11 LEED certification.

4. DETAILED DESIGN SERVICES

The Consultant may be requested to perform Detailed Mechanical Design Services (utilizing the County's Standard Specifications and Details where applicable) based on previously established project requirements. These services may include, but not be limited to the following:

- 4.1 Development and preparation of detailed calculations, mechanical engineering designs, drawings, cost estimates, technical specifications, and special conditions for use with the County standard contract documents;
- 4.2 Resolving detailed problems;
- 4.3 Developing specifications and making equipment recommendations;
- 4.4 Coordinating mechanical engineers and/or other design service groups; Preparing, or collaborating with others responsible for preparing, estimates of the cost of the work;
- 4.5 Providing assistance and advice to the County in bid evaluation and contract award preceding construction, renovations or re-design;
- 4.6 Developing additional standards for use in the project and for separate submittal to the County for incorporation into the County's standard specifications and details in the absence of such; and
- 4.7 Maintaining a document tracking and control system.

5. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION AND GENERAL REVIEW DURING RENOVATION/CONSTRUCTION

The Consultant may be requested to provide these services to assist the County in construction administration and engineering review following award of this contract and during construction of a specific project. These services may include, but not be limited to the following:

- 5.1 Providing advice on the interpretation of contract documents to the County;
- 5.2 Issuing supplementary details and instructions as required;
- 5.3 Reviewing shop drawings for general compliance with design requirements and contract documents;
- 5.4 Reviewing contractor's progress claims, including the validity of additions or deletions;
- 5.5 Reviewing progress certificates and change orders for the client's acceptance;
- 5.6 Making periodic site visits to assess progress generally and conformity of the of the work contract documents;
- 5.7 Reporting to the County on the progress of construction;
- 5.8 Arranging for, and attending, regular site meetings;
- 5.9 Carrying out final review;
- 5.10 Participating in the testing and start-up at the conclusion of the construction contract;
- 5.11 Issuing a substantial performance and/or completion certificate to the County;
- 5.12 Ensuring that the contractor's as-built record drawings are accurate and up to date on a periodic basis and upon completion of the project; and
- 5.13 Maintaining the document tracking and control system.

6. ADDITIONAL SERVICES

The County may request additional services other than those specifically detailed in this RFP as "basic/services" and these requests will vary according to the County needs any given time. These service requests may include, but are not limited to the following:

- 6.1 Extended commissioning and start-up assistance for equipment or facilities;
- 6.2 Preparing plant specific operating and maintenance manuals;
- 6.3 Determining deficiencies during the warranty period;
- 6.4 Preparing the final acceptance document at the end of the warranty period;
- 6.5 Providing assistance in as-built drawing verification;
- 6.6 Facility requirements and utilization studies;
- 6.7 Feasibility studies for new, renovation and alteration projects;
- 6.8 Preparation of program documents;
- 6.9 Preparation of schematic, preliminary, design Development, contract documents, and specifications;
- 6.10 Studies and audits for compliance with federal, state and local regulations;
- 6.11 Services related to minor and/or new construction, renovation and alteration projects;
- 6.12 Additional services which may be required or requested;
- 6.13 Master Planning, building systems surveys;
- 6.14 Facility programming;
- 6.15 Cost estimates.

III. PROPOSAL FORMAT

Responders are required to submit their proposals in the following format:

A. COST PROPOSAL

1. The cost proposal must be submitted in a separate, sealed envelope with the responder's name and RFP title "**Standby Mechanical Engineering and Energy Support Services (Multiyear) – RFP 24-500664**" on the outside of the envelope.
2. The sealed envelope containing the cost proposal may be included in the sealed package containing the technical proposal.
3. **DO NOT INCLUDE FEES OR COSTS IN ANY AREA OUTSIDE OF THIS COST PROPOSAL.** Including fees in any area outside of the Cost Proposal in its separate, sealed envelope shall result in Responder's proposal being deemed non-responsive.
4. Responders are required to submit their costs on Attachment A, *Cost Proposal Form*.
Responder shall not alter the cost proposal form.

B. TECHNICAL PROPOSAL (NOTE: DO NOT INCLUDE ANY COSTS OF ANY KIND IN THIS SECTION.)

1. Technical Proposals must be submitted in a sealed envelope(s) or box(s) with the responder's name and "**Request for Proposals No. 24-500664 for Standby Mechanical Engineering and Energy Support Services (Multiyear)**" on the outside of each envelope or box.
2. Responder shall complete Attachment B, Proposal Cover Sheet, and include this as the first page of the technical proposal.

3. Technical Approach:

- a) Technical Approach: Respondents are expected to provide an overview of their capabilities and experience that speaks to their abilities as a licensed mechanical engineering firm, to provide HVAC and DDC control consultation, manipulation, troubleshooting and design support. Respondents are also expected to introduce their business practices and experience in integrating a complete sustainability, energy management and capability commissioning program in support of the County's intent to be the ideal place to live and work and for its' infrastructure to reflect that intent.
- b) Respondents are expected to show proof of 10 consecutive years of professional engineering licensure within the State of Georgia. Additional engineer certification or advanced degrees from engineering schools, accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET).
 - Responders are required to describe the procedures and methods that will achieve the required outcome of the project as specified herein;
 - Include a listing of the County's responsibilities and the Responder's responsibilities required to complete the project; and
 - Provide a project schedule at the task level starting with the receipt of the Notice to Proceed and ending with project completion.

4. Project Management:

- a) Describe how the project will be organized and managed;
- b) Describe progress reporting procedures for the project;
- c) Include the anticipated use of subcontractors or independent contractors; and
- d) Describe the resources necessary to accomplish the purpose of the project.
- e) Provide information on the Quality assurance processes you have in place.

5. Personnel: Minimum Qualifications:

- a) Proposer shall provide a Project Manager and Principle-in-Charge who have a minimum of five (5) years' experience working on projects of this size and complexity.
- b) Proposer shall provide the resumes and license information for each of the key personnel proposed for this project, specifically those of the Project Manager and the Principle-in-Charge, and all other personnel to be assigned to this project. The resumes shall reflect their responsibilities, previous and current; experience; education and professional history; and length of time employed by the firm as a full-time employee. Resumes shall be limited to no more than three (3) pages per person and be organized according to the following:
 - Name and title
 - Professional Background
 - Current and Past Relevant Experience
 - Relevant Training and Education
 - Courses completed during the past five (5) ears
 - Previous Work Experience in Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing and Fire Protection Design Services and Facility Assessments
 - Include two (2) references for each key personnel member on similar projects
 - Include the role and responsibilities that each key personnel member will perform on this project.
- c) Proposer shall provide a Team Directory showing each team member and include the following for each team member listed: firm name; corporate home office location; address, phone number and e-mail address.
- d) Proposer shall show the percentage of time key personnel will spend on this project during each phase of the project and provide information on the availability of all personnel proposed for this project assuming an NTP will be issued three (3) months from the date of proposal submittal. Response shall include a complete description of other commitments and anticipated completion dates for the personnel assigned to this project.
- e) Proposer must have, at a minimum, three (3) years relevant experience conducting analysis or process reviews for Standby Mechanical Engineering Services for entities comparable to the size of DeKalb County. Such entities include cities and/or counties which provide appraisal and assessment of real and tangible business personal property. Limit your response to two (2) pages and provide the following information per project:
 - The name of the project, the owner, year performed and the project location.
 - Facility description, a photo of the interior and exterior of the facility, indicate size, functions housed, completed cost, and, year completed.
 - Services the proposing firm provided.
 - Indicate whether participation was as the prime or sub-consultant.
 - A reference, including a contact name, addresses and phone number. This reference should be the owner's staff member who was in charge of the project for the owner.
- f). USGBC LEED: Submit project experience where LEED was initiated for design, engineering and construction. This information will be used to verify LEED experience if the County elects to pursue a Silver LEED rating for its projects. If no LEED experience, indicate "None."
 - Indicate name of LEED Accredited Professional

- Indicate LEED project certified rating(s) achieved or submitted for.

Identify the individuals who will be part of the project team; provide detailed resumes of team members and subcontractors who will be directly working on the project. Include any outside personnel, such as subcontractors.

6. Organizational Qualifications:

- a) How many years has Responder operated under current company name? If the responder has operated under other names, list names and dates of use.
- b) Describe Responder's experience, capabilities and other qualifications for this contract.
- c) Has Responder ever been debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded by any Federal or local government department or agency from doing business?

7. Financial Responsibility:

Responder must provide financial statements for the last three (3) years that evidences the responder's financial capabilities to perform the statement of work. (Audited statements are preferable but a minimum of balance sheet, income statement and cash flow statement may be accepted.) Provide year of incorporation (if applicable).

8. References:

- d) Responder shall provide three (3) references for projects similar in size and scope to the project specified herein using the *Reference and Release Form* attached hereto as Attachment C.
- e) Provide three (3) references for each subcontractor proposed as a part of the project team. The references shall be for the same or similar types of services to be performed by the subcontractor (including LSBE-DeKalb and LSBE-MSA firms) on projects similar in size and scope to the project outlined in this RFP. Use Attachment D, Subcontractor Reference and Release Form. Make additional copies as needed.

9. Provide the following information: Are you a DeKalb County Firm? Yes/No.

C. DeKalb First Ordinance

1. It is the objective of the Chief Executive Officer and Board of Commissioners of DeKalb County to provide maximum practicable opportunity for all businesses to participate in the performance of government contracts. 2. It is required that all responding Responders attend the mandatory LSBE meeting within two-weeks of the solicitation's advertisement, and comply, complete and submit all LSBE forms with the Responder's response to remain responsive. D. Federal Work Authorization Program Contractor and Subcontractor Evidence of Compliance

All qualifying contractors and subcontractors performing work with DeKalb County, Georgia must register and participate in the federal work authorization program to verify the work eligibility information of new employees. Successful responder(s) shall be required to register and participate in the federal work authorization program which is a part of Attachment F, *Sample County Contract*. In order for a Proposal to be considered, it is **mandatory** that the *Responder Affidavit*, Attachment G, be completed and submitted with responder’s proposal.

V. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

A. Standard County Contract

The attached sample contract is the County’s standard contract document (see Attachment F), which specifically outlines the contractual responsibilities. All responders should thoroughly review the document prior to submitting a proposal. Any proposed revisions to the terms or language of this document must be submitted in writing with the responder’s response to the request for proposals. Since proposed revisions may result in a proposal being rejected if the revisions are unacceptable to the County, responders should review any proposed revisions with an officer of the firm having authority to execute the contract. No alterations can be made in the contract after award by the Board of Commissioners.

D. Questions

All questions concerning the Project and requests for interpretation of the Contract may be asked and answered at the pre-bid conference; however, oral answers are not authoritative. You may wish to consult an attorney or obtain legal advice prior to making a submission.

J. First Source Jobs Ordinance

The DeKalb County First Source Jobs Ordinance requires contractors or beneficiaries entering into any type of agreement with the County, including purchase orders, regardless of what they may be called, for the procurement or disposal of supplies, services, construction projects, professional or consultant

services, which is funded in whole or part with County funds or County administered funds in which the contractor is to receive \$50,000 or more in County expenditures or committed expenditures and recipient of urban redevelopment action grants or community development block funds administered in the amount of \$50,000 or more make a good faith effort to hire DeKalb County residents for at least 50% of jobs using the First Source Registry (candidate database). M. Right to Audit

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

DEKALB COUNTY, GEORGIA

THIS AGREEMENT made as of this ____ day of ____, 2018, (hereinafter called the “execution date”) by and between DEKALB COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia (hereinafter referred to as the “County”), and _____, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of _____, with offices in _____, _____ (hereinafter referred to as “Contractor”), shall constitute the terms and conditions under which the Contractor shall provide _____ in DeKalb County, Georgia.

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein set forth, the County and the Contractor hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. CONTRACT TERM

The Contractor shall commence the Work under this Contract within ten (10) days from the acknowledgement of receipt of the Notice to Proceed. As required by O.C.G.A §36-60-13, this Contract shall (i) terminate without further obligation on the part of the County each and every December 31st, as required by O.C.G.A. § 36-60-13, as amended, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the termination provisions of this Contract; (ii) automatically renew on each January 1st, unless terminated in accordance with the termination provisions of this Contract; and (iii) terminate absolutely, with no further renewals, on December 31, 20XX, unless extended by Change Order adopted and approved by the DeKalb County Governing Authority and the Contractor in accordance with the terms of this Contract.

ARTICLE II. PAYMENT

As full payment for the faithful performance of this Contract, the County shall pay the Contractor, the Contract Price, which is an amount not to exceed _____ (\$ _____), unless changed by written Change Order in accordance with the terms of this Contract. The term “Change Order” includes the term “amendment” and shall mean a written order authorizing a change in the Work, and an adjustment in Contract Price to Contractor or the Contract Term, as adopted and approved by the Contractor and the DeKalb County Governing Authority, or the Chief Executive Officer, if exempted from Governing Authority adoption and approval in accordance with the express terms of this Contract. The Chief Executive Officer or his/her designee shall have the authority to approve and execute a Change Order lowering the Contract Price or increasing the Contract Price up to twenty percent (20%) of the original Contract Price, provided that the total amount of the increase authorized by such Change Order is less than \$100,000.00. If the original Contract or Purchase Order Price does not exceed \$100,000.00, but the Change Order will make the total Contract Price exceed \$100,000.00, then the Change Order will require approval by official action of the Governing Authority. Any other increase of the Contract Price shall be by Change Order adopted and approved by the DeKalb County Governing Authority and the Contractor in accordance with the terms of this Contract. Amounts paid to the Contractor shall comply with and not exceed Attachment A, the

Contractor's Cost Proposal, consisting of _____ page(s) attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Payment is to be made no later than thirty (30) days after submittal of undisputed invoice.

ARTICLE III. SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor agrees to provide all _____ services in accordance with the County's Request for Proposals (RFP) No. 17-500473 Standby Mechanical Engineering and Energy Support Services (Annual Contract with 2 options to renew)

, attached hereto as Appendix I and incorporated herein by reference, and the Contractor's response thereto, attached hereto as Appendix II and incorporated herein by reference.

The Contractor's services shall include all things, personnel, and materials necessary to accomplish specific projects authorized by the County. Specific Work Authorizations will have precedence over any interpretation within the Contract.

ARTICLE IV. GENERAL CONDITIONS

A. **Accuracy of Work** The Contractor shall be responsible for the accuracy of the Work and any error and/or omission made by the Contractor in any phase of the Work under this Agreement.

B. **Additional Work** The County shall in no way be held liable for any work performed under this section which has not first been approved in writing by the County in the manner required by applicable law and/or the terms of this Contract. The County may at any time order changes within the scope of the Work without invalidating the Contract upon seven (7) days written notice to the Contractor. The Contractor shall proceed with the performance of any changes in the Work so ordered by the County unless such change entitles the Contractor to a change in Contract Price, and/or Contract Term, in which event the Contractor shall give the County written notice thereof within fifteen (15) days after the receipt of the ordered change, and the Contractor shall not execute such changes until it receives an executed Change Order from

the County. No extra cost or extension of time shall be allowed unless approved by the County and authorized by execution of a Change Order. The parties' execution of any Change Order constitutes a final settlement of all matters relating to the change in the Work which is the subject of the Change Order. The County shall not be liable for payment for any work performed under this section which has not first been approved in writing by the County in the manner required by applicable law and/or the terms of this Contract.

C. **Ownership of Documents** All documents, including drawings, estimates, specifications, and data are and remain the property of the County. The Contractor agrees that the County may reuse any and all plans, specifications, drawings, estimates, or any other data or documents described herein in its sole discretion without first obtaining permission of the Contractor and without any payment of any monies to the Contractor therefore. However, any reuse of the documents by the County on a different site shall be at its risk and the Contractor shall have no liability where such documents are reused.

D. **Right to Audit** The County shall have the right to audit all books and records, including electronic records, relating or pertaining to this contract or agreement, including but not limited to all financial and performance related records, property, and equipment purchased in whole or in part with County funds and any documents or materials which support those records, kept under the control of the Contractor, including but not limited to those kept by the Contractor's employees, agents, assigns, successors and subcontractors. The County also has the right to communicate with Contractor's employees related to the audited records.

The Contractor shall maintain such books and records, together with such supporting or underlying documents and materials, for the duration of this contract and for seven (7) years after termination or expiration, including any and all renewals thereof. The books and records, together with supporting documents and materials shall be made available, upon request to the County or its designee, during normal business hours at the Contractor's office or place of business. In the event that no such location is available, then the books, records, and supporting documents shall be made available for audit at a time and location which is convenient for the County.

E. **Successors and Assigns** The Contractor agrees it shall not sublet, assign, transfer, pledge, convey, sell, or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of this Contract or his right, title, or interest therein to any person, firm, or corporation without the previous written consent of the County. If the County consents to any such assignment or transfer, then the Contractor binds itself, its partners, successors and assigns to all covenants of this Contract. Nothing contained in this Contract shall create, nor be interpreted to create privity, or any other relationship whatsoever, between the County and any person, or entity or than Contractor.

F. **Reviews and Acceptance** Work performed by the Contractor shall be subject to review and acceptance in stages as required by the County. Acceptance shall not relieve the Contractor of its professional obligation to correct, at his own expense, any errors in the Work.

G. **Termination of Agreement** The Contractor understands and agrees that the date of the beginning of Work, rate of progress, and time for completion of the Work are essential conditions of this Contract. The County may, for its own convenience and at its sole option,

without cause and without prejudice to any other right or remedy of County, elect to terminate the Contract by delivering to the Contractor, at the address listed in the Notices article of this Contract, a written notice of termination specifying the effective date of termination. Such notice shall be delivered to Contractor at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination. If Contractor's services are terminated by the County, the termination will not affect any rights or remedies of the County then existing or which may thereafter accrue against Contractor or its surety. In case of termination of this Contract before completion of the Work, Contractor will be paid only for the portion of the Work satisfactorily performed through the effective date of termination as determined by the County. Neither party shall be entitled to recover lost profits, special, consequential or punitive damages, attorney's fees or costs from the other party to this Contract for any reason whatsoever. This Contract shall not be deemed to provide any third-party with any remedy, claim, right of action, or other right. The parties' obligations pursuant to this Section shall survive any acceptance of Work, or termination or expiration of this Contract.

H. Indemnification Agreement The Contractor shall be responsible from the execution date or from the time of the beginning of the Work, whichever shall be the earlier, for all injury or damage of any kind resulting from the Work, to persons or property, including employees and property of the County. The Contractor shall exonerate, indemnify, and save harmless the County, its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and servants, hereinafter collectively referred to in this Section as "the County Indemnitees," from and against all claims or actions based upon or arising out of any damage or injury (including without limitation any injury or death to persons and any damage to property) caused by or sustained in connection with the performance of this Contract or by conditions created thereby or arising out of or any way connected with Work performed under this Contract, as well as all expenses incidental to the defense of any such claims, litigation, and actions. Furthermore, Contractor shall assume and pay for, without cost to the County Indemnitees, the defense of any and all claims, litigation, and actions suffered through any act or omission of the Contractor, or any Subcontractor, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by or under the supervision of any of them. Notwithstanding any language or provision in this Contract, Contractor shall not be required to indemnify any County Indemnitee against claims, actions, or expenses based upon or arising out of the County Indemnitee's sole negligence. As between the County Indemnitees and the Contractor as the other party, the Contractor shall assume responsibility and liability for any damage, loss, or injury, including death, of any kind or nature whatever to person or property, resulting from any kind of claim made by Contractor's employees, agents, vendors, Suppliers or Subcontractors caused by or resulting from the performance of Work under this Contract, or caused by or resulting from any error, omission, or the negligent or intentional act of the Contractor, vendors, Suppliers, or Subcontractors, or any of their officers, agents, servants, or employees. The Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County Indemnitees from and against any and all claims, loss, damage, charge, or expense to which they or any of them may be put or subjected by reason of any such damage, loss, or injury. The Contractor expressly agrees to provide a full and complete defense against any claims brought or actions filed against the County Indemnitees, where such claim or action involves, in whole or in part, the subject of the indemnity contained in this Contract, whether such claims or actions are rightfully or wrongfully brought or filed. The County has the sole discretion to choose the counsel who will provide the defense. No provision of this Contract and nothing herein shall be construed as creating any individual or personal liability on the part of any elected official, officer, employee, agent or servant of the County, nor shall the Contract be construed as giving any rights or benefits

hereunder to anyone other than the parties to this Contract. The parties' obligations pursuant to this Section shall survive any acceptance of Work, or termination or expiration of this Contract.

I. **Insurance** Prior to commencing work, Contractor shall, at its sole expense, procure and maintain insurance of the types and in the amounts described below from insurer(s) authorized to transact business in the state where the work or operations will be performed by Contractor. Such insurance shall be placed with admitted insurers that maintain an A.M. Best's rating of not less than "A" (Excellent) with a Financial Size Category of VII or better with coverage forms acceptable to Contractor. The insurance described below shall be maintained uninterrupted for the duration of the project, including any warranty periods, and shall protect Contractor, and others as required by contract, for liabilities in connection with work performed by or on behalf of Contractor, its agents, representatives, employees or Contractors.

1. Certificates of Insurance in companies doing business in Georgia and acceptable to the County covering:

- (a) Statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance, or proof that Contractor is not required to provide such coverage under State law;
 - (1) Employer's liability insurance by accident, each accident \$1,000,000
 - (2) Employer's liability insurance by disease, policy limit \$1,000,000
 - (3) Employer's liability insurance by disease, each employee \$1,000,000
- (b) Professional Liability Insurance on the Contractor's services in this Agreement with limit of \$1,000,000;
- (c) Commercial General Liability Insurance covering all operations with combined single limit of \$1,000,000;
- (d) Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance with form coverage for all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles with combined single limit of \$1,000,000.
- (e) Umbrella or Excess Insurance. Umbrella or excess insurance is to be provided with General Liability, Auto Liability and Employers Liability scheduled as underlying policies with limits not less than the following:
\$5,000,000 per occurrence
\$5,000,000 aggregate

2. Additional Insured Requirement:

- (a) The County, its elected officials, officers, employees and agents, hereinafter referred to in this article and in the article entitled "Certificates of Insurance" as "the County and its officers" are to be named as additional insured on all policies of insurance except worker's compensation insurance with no cross suits exclusion. The County and its officers shall be included as additional insureds under commercial general liability and commercial umbrella insurance, for liabilities arising out of both the ongoing and completed operations of Contractor. Such additional insured coverage shall be endorsed to Contractor's policy by attachment of ISO Additional Insured Endorsement forms CG 20 10 10 01 (ongoing operations) and CG 20 37 10 01 (products-completed operations), or form(s) providing equivalent coverage.

- (b) All coverages required of the Contractor will be primary over any insurance or self-insurance program carried by the County.
 - (c) If the Contractor is a joint venture involving two (2) or more entities, then each independent entity will satisfy the limits and coverages specified here or the joint venture will be a named insured under each respective policy specified.
3. Fidelity Bond coverage shall be provided. Coverage limits shall not be less than the amount scheduled in the contract.
4. Certificates of Insurance must be executed in accordance with the following provisions:
- (a) Certificates to contain policy number, policy limits, and policy expiration date of all policies issued in accordance with this Agreement;
 - (b) Certificates to contain the location and operations to which the insurance applies;
 - (c) Certificates to contain Contractor's protective coverage for any subcontractor's operations;
 - (d) Certificates to contain Contractor's contractual liability insurance coverage;
 - (e) Certificates are to be **issued** to:

5. The Contractor shall be wholly responsible for securing certificates of insurance coverage as set forth above from all subcontractors who are engaged in this work.
6. The Contractor agrees to carry statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance and to have all subcontractors likewise carry statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance.
7. Contractor agrees to waive all rights of subrogation and other rights of recovery against the County and its officers and shall cause each Subcontractor to waive all rights of subrogation for all coverage, excluding Professional E&O.
8. Failure of the County to demand such certificate or other evidence of full compliance with these insurance requirements or failure of the County to identify a deficiency from evidence provided will not be construed as a waiver of the Contractor's obligation to maintain such coverage. Contractor understands and agrees that the purchase of insurance in no way limits the liability of the Contractor.
9. Certificates shall state that the policy or policies shall not expire, be cancelled or altered without at least sixty (60) days prior written notice to the County. Policies and Certificates of Insurance listing the County and its officers as additional insureds (except for workers' compensation insurance) shall conform to all terms and conditions

(including coverage of the indemnification and hold harmless agreement) contained in this Contract.

10. If the County shall so request, the Contractor will furnish the County for its inspection and approval such policies of insurance with all endorsements, or confirmed specimens thereof certified by the insurance company to be true and correct copies. Contractor shall be responsible and have the financial wherewithal to cover any deductibles or retentions included on the certificate of insurance.

J. Georgia Laws Govern The laws of the State of Georgia shall govern the construction of this Contract without regard for conflicts of laws. Should any provision of this Contract require judicial interpretation, it is agreed that the court interpreting or construing the same shall not apply a presumption that the terms hereof shall be more strictly construed against one party, by reason of the rule of construction, that a document is to be construed more strictly against the party who itself or through its agent prepared same; it being agreed that the agents of all parties have participated in the preparation hereof, and all parties have had an adequate opportunity to consult with legal counsel. In interpreting this Contract in its entirety, the printed provisions of this Contract, and any additions written or typed hereon, shall be given equal weight, and there shall be no inference by operation of law or otherwise; that any provision of this Contract shall be construed against either party hereto.

K. Venue This Agreement shall be deemed to have been made and performed in DeKalb County, Georgia. For the purposes of venue, all suits or causes of action arising out of this Agreement shall be brought in the courts of DeKalb County, Georgia.

L. Contractor and Subcontractor Evidence of Compliance; Federal Work Authorization Pursuant to O.C.G.A. §13-10-91, the County cannot enter into a contract for the physical performance of services unless the Contractor, its Subcontractor(s) and sub-subcontractor(s), as that term is defined by state law, register and participate in the Federal Work Authorization Program to verify specific information on all new employees. Contractor certifies that it has complied and will continue to comply throughout the Contract Term with O.C.G.A. §13-10-91 and any related and applicable Georgia Department of Labor Rule. Contractor agrees to sign an affidavit evidencing its compliance with O.C.G.A. §13-10-91. The signed affidavit is attached to this Contract as Attachment B. Contractor agrees that in the event it employs or contracts with any Subcontractor(s) in connection with this Contract, Contractor will secure from each Subcontractor an affidavit that certifies the Subcontractor's current and continuing compliance with O.C.G.A. §13-10-91 throughout the Contract Term. Any signed Subcontractor affidavit(s) obtained in connection with this Contract shall be attached hereto as Attachment C. Each Subcontractor agrees that in the event it employs or contracts with any sub-subcontractor(s), each Subcontractor will secure from each sub-subcontractor an affidavit that certifies the sub-subcontractor's current and continuing compliance with O.C.G.A. §13-10-91 throughout the Contract Term. Any signed sub-subcontractor affidavit(s) obtained in connection with this Contract shall be attached hereto as Attachment D.

M. County Representative The County may designate a representative through whom the Contractor will contact the County. In the event of such designation, said representative shall be consulted and his written recommendation obtained before any request for extra work is

presented to the County. Payments to the Contractor shall be made only upon itemized bill submitted to and approved by said representative.

N. **Contractor's Status** The Contractor will supervise and direct the Work, including the Work of all Subcontractors. Only persons skilled in the type of work which they are to perform shall be employed. The Contractor shall, at all times, maintain discipline and good order among his employees, and shall not employ any unfit person or persons or anyone unskilled in the work assigned him. The relationship between the County and the Contractor shall be that of owner and independent contractor. Other than the consideration set forth herein, the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, employees, and any Subcontractors shall not be entitled to any County employee benefits including, but not limited to social security, insurance, paid annual leave, sick leave, worker's compensation, free parking or retirement benefits. All services provided by Contractor shall be by employees of Contractor or its Subcontractors and subject to supervision by Contractor. No officer or employee of Contractor or any Subcontractor shall be deemed an officer or employee of the County. Personnel policies, tax responsibilities, social security payments, health insurance, employee benefits and other administrative policies, procedures or requirements applicable to the Work or services rendered under this Contract shall be those of the Contractor, not the County.

O. **Georgia Open Records Act** Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Georgia Open Records Act, O.C.G.A. §50-18-70 *et seq.*

P. **First Source Jobs Ordinance and Preferred Employees** The Contractor is required to comply with the DeKalb County First Source Jobs Ordinance, Code of DeKalb County as Revised 1988, section 2-231 *et seq.*, and among other things, is required to make a good faith effort to hire DeKalb County residents for at least fifty percent 50% of all jobs created by an Eligible Project, as that term is defined in the First Source Ordinance, using the First Source Registry. Contractors, subcontractors, and independent contractors bidding on this contract will be encouraged by DeKalb County to have 25% or more of their labor forces for this project consist of Preferred Employees selected from the First Source Registry. The First Source Registry has Preferred Employees trained by U.S. Department of Labor registered apprenticeship programs and other partners. Q. **Business License** Contractor shall submit a copy of its current, valid business license with this Contract. If the Contractor is a Georgia corporation, Contractor shall submit a valid county or County business license. If Contractor is a joint venture, Contractor shall submit valid business licenses for each member of the joint venture. If the Contractor is not a Georgia corporation, Contractor shall submit a certificate of authority to transact business in the state of Georgia and a copy of its current, valid business license issued by its home jurisdiction. If Contractor holds a professional license, then Contractor shall submit a copy of the valid professional license. Failure to provide the business license, certificate of authority, or professional license required by this section, may result in the Contract being terminated. Contractor shall ensure that any insurance, license, permit or certificate submitted in response to the County's RFP or as part of the Contract shall be current and valid when submitted, and shall remain valid, current and maintained in good standing for the Contract Term.

R. **Sole Agreement** This Contract constitutes the sole contract between the County and the Contractor. The terms, conditions, and requirements of this Contract may not be modified, except by Change Order. No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent, or employee of the County, either before or after the execution of the Contract, shall affect or modify any of the terms or obligations herein contained. No representations, oral or written, shall be binding on the parties unless expressly incorporated herein. No Change Order shall be enforceable unless approved by official action of the County as provided by law or in this Contract.

T. **Severability** If any provision of this Contract or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall to any extent be held invalid, then the remainder of this Contract or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances, other than those as to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby, and each provision of this Contract shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

U. **Notices** Any notice or consent required to be given by or on behalf of any party hereto to any other party hereto shall be in writing and shall be sent to the County's Chief Executive Officer and the Executive Assistant or to the Contractor or his authorized representative on the work site by (a) registered or certified United States mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, (b) personal delivery, or (c) overnight courier service. All notices sent to the addresses listed below shall be binding unless said address is changed in writing no less than fourteen days before such notice is sent. Future changes in address shall be effective upon written notice being given by the Contractor to the County's Executive Assistant or by the County to the Contractor's authorized representative via certified first class U.S. mail, return receipt requested.
