The County reserves the right to make no awards, one award of all items or multiple awards of items. The method utilized to solicit bids and proposals is determined by the estimated dollar value of the individual purchase or the type of commodity or service needed.

The Purchasing and Contracting Department is now utilizing <u>iSupplier</u> to manage our vendor relationships electronically. It is very important that any vendor/supplier interested in or currently doing business with DeKalb County go to our <u>iSupplier</u> page to obtain all necessary information concerning registration, account management, invoicing/payments and links to iSupplier's training and instructional documentation.
