Community Development Block Grant Recovery Act Program (CDBG-R)

INTRODUCTION

DeKalb County receives funds annually from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) and Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) grants. This is the Third Amendment to the DeKalb County 2008 Action Plan, which was approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) during January 2008. This Substantial Amendment is necessary to allow the use of new Federal HUD funding. All of the elements of the County's original 2008 Action Plan are hereby incorporated into this supplemental document.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) was signed into law on February 17, 2009, and appropriates \$787 billion for measures that will modernize our nation's infrastructure, enhance energy independence, expand educational opportunities, preserve and improve affordable health care, provide tax relief and protect those in greatest need. The Recovery Act includes \$1 billion in Community Development Block Grant Recovery (CDBG-R) funds to support a broad range of housing and community development projects that can be implemented as soon as possible.

The County will receive **\$1,543,400** in CDBG-R funds that constitute a supplemental appropriation of 2008 CDBG funding. The purpose of this Substantial Amendment is to describe the County's proposed use of the CDBG-R funds.

B. CDBG-R INFORMATION BY ACTIVITY (COMPLETE FOR EACH ACTIVITY)

(1) **Activity #1 Name:** Friends of Disabled Adults and Children Too, Inc.

(2) **Activity #1 Narrative:**

- a. The purpose of this project is to provide funds for the renovation of a facility owned by the Friends of Disabled Adults and Children Too, Inc. This agency provides home health care equipment-mobility aids and daily living devices for people disabled or newly injured. This project is eligible as a public facilities and improvements activity (570.201 (c) and meets the national objective of benefiting low- and moderate-income clientele (570.208 (a) (2).

This project is of critical importance because it will serve the needs of a special population and will accomplish this by:

- Client waiting areas will be expanded by the new lobby.
 - Client loading/unloading areas will be protected by the new awning.
 - Equipment fitting/matching areas in and behind the main lobby.
 - Security in and outside of the facility.
 - The new loading dock will enhance the flow of incoming donations which will ensure sanitized equipment stays separate from insanities equipment.
 - A first class sanitization room including a “hub scrub” in a tiled room for pressure washing with new washer/dryer for seating materials and other porous items.
 - Renovating aging restrooms ADA accessible for staff and volunteers.
 - Complete energy saving projects such as recoating our 100yd south wall, retrofitting all lighting and ballasts, and replacing windows.
 - The addition of a vehicle lift for the vehicle modification program will allow safer and faster installations of refurbished lifts onto client vehicles.
 - Additional program sustainability and income will be enhanced by the expansion of our on-site Thrift Store sales floor and sorting area.
- b. This project is compliant with Title XII of Division A and Section 1602 of the Recovery Act based on an anticipated contract award date that is within 120 days from the date the funds will be made available. The anticipated project start date is December 2009.
- c. This project will maximize job creation and economic benefit in relation to the CDBG-R funds obligated, as shown below.

- **Preserving and creating jobs and promoting economic recovery**
This project is a facilities and improvements project which will create 25 full time construction jobs to promote economic recovery.
 - **Assisting those most impacted by the recession**
Persons who are disabled with limited resources and mobility are often the first and most impacted in a recession. By providing improvements to this facility the agency will be able to increase the capacity and efficiency of organization, and help more persons with disabilities, their families and their caretakers. Although the County cannot document the degree to which this project will enable people with disabilities to achieve and maintain a suitable standard of living, DeKalb County has all confidence that this project will assist individuals with disabilities by helping to provide the mobility that is necessary to achieve and maintain employment.
 - **Providing investment needed to increase economic efficiency**
The renovation of this project will help increase economic efficiency by helping persons with disabilities gain greater access to this site and improved access to the facility's programs. The equipment provided will enhance the individual's quality of life at home, at play and, most importantly, in the work environment.
- d. This project will address the Recovery Act, as shown below.
- **Preserving and creating jobs and promoting economic recovery**
This project is a facilities and improvements project which will create 25 twenty five full time construction jobs to promote economic recovery.
 - **Assisting those most impacted by the recession**
Persons who are disabled with limited resources and mobility are often the first and most impacted in a recession. By providing improvements to this facility the agency will be able to increase the capacity and efficiency of organization, and help more persons with disabilities, their families and their caretakers. Although the County cannot document the degree to which this project will enable people with disabilities to achieve and maintain a suitable standard of living, DeKalb County has all confidence that this project will assist individuals with disabilities by helping to provide the mobility that is necessary to achieve and maintain employment.
 - **Providing investment needed to increase economic efficiency**
The renovation of this project will be able to help increasing economic efficiency by being able to help more persons with disabilities, greater access to this site and improved access to the facility's programs.

- **Investing in transportation, environmental protection, or other infrastructure that will provide long-term economic benefits**
The renovation of the project will reduce facility traffic congestion, renovating aging restrooms, providing a first class sanitation room for customer personal hygiene maintenance.
- **Minimizing or avoiding reductions in essential services**
These renovations will include expansion of the waiting area, protecting the customers from inclement weather with a new loading/unloading areas with awnings, a new loading dock for transporting customers, a first class sanitation room for customer personal hygiene maintenance, renovating aging restrooms, retrofitting our lighting and windows, building a state of the art vehicle lifts. These and other improvements, ultimately seeks to help them be in further compliance with the American Disabilities Act and provide a more rewarding and user friendly environment for the customers and their caretakers.
- **Fostering energy independence**
The project is retrofitting the electrical fixtures and lighting system as well as replacing old windows with more energy efficient windows in an effort to conserve energy. Additionally, green energy sources will be considered in an effort to create more energy independence.

(3) Jobs Created:

We estimate that 25 full time construction jobs will be created by this funding and two permanent full time jobs will be created within the next two to three years. The additional private funding that the project leverages will fund 4 full time temporary jobs within the organization for planning and administering the projects.

(4) Additional Activity Information:

The Friend of Disabled Adults and Children Too, Inc. project is a facilities improvement project that will chiefly stimulate job creation and long-term economic benefit. The County and agency will make every effort to incorporate the latest techniques to promote energy conservation, green building techniques and reduce pollution emissions.

(5) Responsible Organization:

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(1) **Activity #2 Name:** DeKalb County Fire and Rescue – Fire Station #10 Renovation

(2) **Activity #2 Narrative:**

- a. The renovation project will update an existing fire station facility to a more modern, energy efficient, and maintainable facility that when completed, will be capable of housing additional personnel, modern firefighting, and emergency rescue equipment. The existing facility was constructed during the 1960's and does not meet current space requirements. This project is eligible as a public facilities and improvements activity 570.201 (c) and meets the national objective of Area Benefit 570.208 (a) (1).
- b. This project is compliant with Title XII of Division A and Section 1602 of the Recovery Act based on an anticipated contract award date that is within 120 days from the date the funds will be made available. The anticipated project start date is December 2009.
- c. This project will maximize job creation and economic benefit in relation to the CDBG-R funds obligated, as shown below.
 - **Preserving and creating jobs and promoting economic recovery**
This project is a facilities and improvements project which will create an estimated 30 full time construction jobs.
 - **Assisting those most impacted by the recession**
Local small contractors hurt by the economic downturn in the economy that would help provide the construction and design of the renovation project would benefit.
 - **Investing in transportation, environmental protection, or other infrastructure that will provide long-term economic benefits**
The renovation of Fire Station #10 will expand the current structure and allow greater utilization of an existing County facility. Through the modernization of this facility, the County will maximize utilization and forego the additional cost burden associated with the construction of another fire station.
- d. This project will address the Recovery Act, as shown below.
 - **Preserving and creating jobs and promoting economic recovery**
This project is a facilities and improvements project which will create an estimated 30 full time construction jobs.

- **Assisting those most impacted by the recession**
Local small contractors hurt by the economic downturn in the economy that would provide the construction and design of the facility would benefit.

This project will modernize a facility and allow for a more effective and efficient use of space. The renovation will allow the facility to house a greater number of emergency and fire rescue vehicles which will enable fire station #10 a more timely response to a larger number of fire/rescue calls.

The renovation of Fire Station #10 will expand the current structure and allow greater utilization of an existing County facility. Through the modernization of this facility, the County will maximize utilization and delay the need for future construction of another fire station.

DeKalb County Fire Rescue Station #10 is a facilities improvement project that will chiefly stimulate job creation and long-term economic benefit. The County will make every effort to incorporate the latest techniques to promote energy conservation, smart growth, green building techniques, and reduce pollution emissions.

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(1) **Activity #3 Name:** City of Doraville – Central Avenue Sidewalks

(2) **Activity #3 Narrative:**

- a. The purpose of this project is to provide funds for installation of new sidewalks located at both sides of Central Avenue in the City of Doraville. Central Avenue is main connector for pedestrian traffic from Buford Highway to the Doraville MARTA rail Station on New Peachtree Road. Pedestrian traffic is prevalent in this area due to the close proximity of the MARTA Station. Currently, pedestrians are walking on the roadway due to the lack of sidewalk connectivity. This is a deterrent to the health, safety, and welfare of the residents in the community. This project is eligible as a public facilities and improvements activity 570.201 (c) and meets the national objective of Area Benefit 570.208 (a)(1).
- b. This project is compliant with Title XII of Division A and Section 1602 of the Recovery Act based on an anticipated contract award date that is within 120 days from the date the funds will be made available. The anticipated project start date is December 2009.
- c. This project will maximize job creation and economic benefit in relation to the CDBG-R funds obligated, as shown below.
 - **Preserving and creating jobs and promoting economic recovery**
This project is an infrastructure improvements project which will create an estimated 10 full time construction jobs.

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(1) **Activity #4 Name:** City of Stone Mountain – Drainage Pipe Replacement

(2) **Activity #4 Narrative:**

- a. The purpose of this project is to provide funds for installation of new drainage pipe located at Sheppard Way in the City of Stone Mountain. The new drainage will assist in the elimination of street flooding and erosion during heavy rain. This project is eligible as a public facilities and improvements activity 570.201 (c) and this project meets the national objective of Area Benefit 570.208 (a)(1).
- b. This project is compliant with Title XII of Division A and Section 1602 of the Recovery Act based on an anticipated contract award date that is within 120 days from the date the funds will be made available. The anticipated project start date is December 2009.
- c. This project will maximize job creation and economic benefit in relation to the CDBG-R funds obligated, as shown below.
 - **Preserving and creating jobs and promoting economic recovery**
This project is a facilities and improvements project which will create five full time temporary construction jobs.
 - **Assisting those most impacted by the recession**
Local small contractors hurt by the economic downturn in the economy that would provide the construction and design of the drainage improvements would benefit. Drainage improvements help to maintain and enhance property values.
 - **Providing investment needed to increase economic efficiency**

This project is a facilities and improvements project which will create five full time construction jobs.
 - **Assisting those most impacted by the recession**
Local small contractors hurt by the economic downturn in the economy that would provide the construction and design of the drainage improvements would benefit. Drainage improvements help to maintain and enhance property values.
 - **Providing investment needed to increase economic efficiency**
This project will increase the capacity of drainage pipe and reduce the possibility of flood to adjacent properties. The renovation will protect adjacent properties value and promote public health and welfare for the neighborhood.

This project is an infrastructure improvement project which will provide long term economic benefits. This project will help to reduce flooding in business and residential areas.

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(1) **Activity #5 Name:** City of Chamblee – Installation of Peachtree Road Sidewalks

(2) **Activity #5 Narrative:**

- a. The purpose of this project is to provide funds for installation of new sidewalks located at Peachtree Road in the City of Chamblee. Peachtree Road is the main connector for pedestrian traffic from mixed use neighborhoods in the area to the Chamblee MARTA Station and the Wal-Mart Store on Peachtree Road. Pedestrian traffic is prevalent in this area due to the close proximity of the MARTA Station. The installation of a sidewalk at this location will enhance and encourage pedestrian transportation as an alternative to the automobile. It will furthermore encourage a live, work, and play community with decreased fuel dependency. This project is eligible as a public facilities and improvements activity 570.201 (c) and this project meets the national objective of Area Benefit 570.208 (a)(1).
- b. This project is compliant with Title XII of Division A and Section 1602 of the Recovery Act based on an anticipated contract award date that is within 120 days from the date the funds will be made available. The anticipated project start date is December 2009.
- c. This project will maximize job creation and economic benefit in relation to the CDBG-R funds obligated, as shown below.

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C. PUBLIC COMMENT

As a further measure, this ad was mailed to all of the County's Departments, local municipalities, participating non-profit agencies, and faith based organizations. CERTIFICATIONS

- (1) **Affirmatively furthering fair housing.** The jurisdiction will affirmatively further fair housing, which means that it will conduct an analysis to identify impediments to fair housing choice within the jurisdiction, take appropriate actions to overcome the effects of any impediments identified through that analysis, and maintain records reflecting the analysis and actions in this regard.
- (2) **Anti-displacement and relocation plan.** The jurisdiction will comply with the acquisition and relocation requirements of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended (42 U.S.C. 4601), and implementing regulations at 49 CFR part 24; and it has in effect and is following a residential anti-displacement and relocation assistance plan required under section 104(d) of the housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, in connection with any activity assisted with funding under CDBG-R.
- (3) **Drug Free Workplace.** The jurisdiction will or will continue to provide a drug-free workplace by:

 - (a) Abide by the terms of the statement; and
 - (b) Notify the employer in writing of his or her conviction for a violation of a criminal drug statute occurring in the workplace no later than five calendar days after such conviction;
 5. Notifying the agency in writing, within ten calendar days after receiving notice under subparagraph 4(b) from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction. Employers of convicted employees must provide notice, including position title, to every grant officer or other designee on whose grant activity the convicted employee was working, unless the Federal agency has designated a central point for the receipt of such notices. Notice shall include the identification number(s) of each affected grant;
 6. Taking one of the following actions, within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph 4(b), with respect to any employee who is so convicted:
 - (a) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or

(b) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency;

7. Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.

(4) **Anti-lobbying.** To the best of the jurisdiction's knowledge and belief:

1. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of it, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement;

2. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, it will complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions; and

3. It will require that the language of paragraph 1 and 2 of this anti-lobbying certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

(5) **Authority of Jurisdiction.** The jurisdiction possesses the legal authority to carry out the programs for which it is seeking funding, in accordance with applicable HUD regulations and other program requirements.

(6) **Consistency with Plan.** The housing activities to be undertaken with CDBG-R funds are consistent with its consolidated plan.

(7) **Section 3.** The jurisdiction will comply with section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (12 U.S.C. 1701u), and implementing regulations at 24 CFR part 135.

(8) **Community development plan.** The jurisdiction certifies that the consolidated housing and community development plan identifies housing and community development needs and specifies both short-term and long-term community development objectives that have been developed in accordance with the primary objective of the statute authorizing the CDBG program.

(9) **Following a plan.** The jurisdiction is following a current consolidated plan that has been approved by HUD.

(10) **Use of funds.** The jurisdiction has developed activities so as to give the maximum feasible priority to activities that will benefit low- and moderate-income families or aid in the prevention of slums or blight. Additional activities may be included that are designed to meet other community development needs having particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community where other financial resources are not available to meet such needs. It has complied with the following criteria:

1. Maximum Feasible Priority. With respect to activities expected to be assisted with CDBG-R funds, it certifies that it has developed its Action Plan so as to give maximum feasible priority to activities which benefit low and moderate income families or aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight. The Action Plan may also include activities which the grantee certifies are designed to meet other community development needs having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community, and other financial resources are not available);

2. Special Assessments. The jurisdiction will not attempt to recover any capital costs of public improvements assisted with CDBG-R funds by assessing any amount against properties owned and occupied by persons of low- and moderate-income, including any fee charged or assessment made as a condition of obtaining access to such public improvements. However, if CDBG-R funds are used to pay the proportion of a fee or assessment attributable to the capital costs of public improvements (assisted in part with CDBG-R funds) financed from other revenue sources, an assessment or charge may be made against the property with respect to the public improvements financed by a source other than CDBG-R funds. The jurisdiction will not attempt to recover any capital costs of public improvements assisted with CDBG-R funds, unless CDBG-R funds are used to pay the proportion of fee or assessment attributable to the capital costs of public improvements financed from other revenue sources. In this case, an assessment or charge may be made against the property with respect to the public improvements financed by a source other than CDBG-R funds. In addition, with respect to properties owned and occupied by moderate-income (but not low-income) families, an assessment or charge may be made against the property with respect to the public improvements financed by a source other than CDBG-R funds if the jurisdiction certifies that it lacks CDBG-R or CDBG funds to cover the assessment.

(11) Excessive Force. The jurisdiction certifies that it has adopted and is enforcing: (1) a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and (2) a policy of enforcing applicable State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location that is the subject of such non-violent civil rights demonstrations within its jurisdiction.

(12) Compliance with anti-discrimination laws. The CDBG-R grant will be conducted and administered in conformity with title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d), the Fair Housing Act (42 U.S.C. 3601-3619), and implementing regulations.

(13) Compliance with lead-based paint procedures. The activities concerning lead-based paint will comply with the requirements of part 35, subparts A, B, J, K, and R of this title.

(14) Compliance with laws. The jurisdiction will comply with applicable laws.

(15) Compliance with ARRA. The jurisdiction will comply with Title XII of Division A of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

(16) Project selection. The jurisdiction will select projects to be funded, by giving priority to projects that can award contracts based on bids within 120 days from the date the funds are made available to the recipient, and that will ensure maximum job creation and economic benefit.

(17) Timeliness of infrastructure investments. When the jurisdiction uses CDBG-R funds for infrastructure investments, the grantee will give preference to quick-start and finish activities, including a goal to use at least 50 percent of the funds for activities within 120 days of enactment of the Recovery Act.

(18) **Buy American provision.** The jurisdiction will ensure that all iron, steel and manufactured goods used in construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance of a public building or public work project assisted with CDBG-R funds under the Recovery Act must be produced in the United States unless the Secretary finds that: (1) the requirement is inconsistent with public interest; (2) those goods are not reasonably available or produced in sufficient quantity in the U.S.; (3) or the use of the goods will increase the project cost by more than 25 percent.

(19) **Appropriate use of funds for infrastructure investments.** The Governor, mayor, or other chief executive, as appropriate certifies, that any infrastructure investments have received the full review and vetting required by law and that the chief executive accepts responsibility that the infrastructure investment is an appropriate use of taxpayer dollars. Alternatively, a grantee's chief elected official certifies that infrastructure investments will receive the full review and vetting required by law and that the chief executive accepts responsibility that the infrastructure investment is an appropriate use of taxpayer dollars.

(20) **70% of CDBG-R for LMI.** The aggregate use of CDBG-R funds shall principally benefit persons of low and moderate income in a manner that ensures that at least 70 percent of the grant is expended for activities that benefit such persons over the life of the CDBG-R grant.

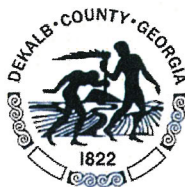
