In 2015, the Georgia Legislature, through House Bill 599 (2015 GA Law § 3826 DeKalb County Independent Internal Audits), established an independent audit function consisting of an Audit Oversight Committee with 5 voting members, a Chief Audit Executive, and Office of Internal Audit. The bill provides for an on-going objective assessment of the proper use of public funds and administration of public programs. The opportunity to serve as Chief Audit Executive is currently available.



Government Structure

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is the County's top elected official. The County has 44 departments with most department heads reporting to the CEO through the Chief Operating Officer (COO). Like other county governments, there is a Board of Commissioners (BOC) that comprises the legislative branch, a court system that is the judicial branch, and other elected officials and constitutional officers.

The Audit Oversight Committee (AOC)

It is essential to the proper administration and operation of the DeKalb County government that public officials, government managers, and private citizens know not only whether government funds are handled properly and in compliance with laws and regulations, but also whether public programs are achieving the purposes for which they were authorized and funded, and whether they are doing so efficiently, effectively, and equitably. The DeKalb County Audit Oversight Committee serves to provide a platform for the independent internal audit function of DeKalb County.

Imagine yourself in this role...

As Chief Audit Executive, you will report to the AOC, and serve as DeKalb County's catalyst for a more transparent government. Appointed by the Board of Commissioners for a term of five years with a two-term limit, you will be responsible for staffing and leading the Office of Internal Audit and for promoting "good" government in DeKalb County by conducting:

- county-wide independent performance and financial audits
- assessments of the efficiency and integrity of County operations, including the adequacy of policies and procedures
- reviews to determine the existence of effective integrated internal controls
- investigations of allegations and complaints involving fraud, waste, abuse, and misconduct
- follow-up on audit recommendations to determine if corrective action has been taken

You will use your knowledge and expertise to recommend ways to improve legal, fiscal, and ethical accountability. This position will attract, motivate, and retain talented audit staff.

This position has subpoen powers, unrestricted access, and enforcement capability through the Superior Court of DeKalb County; and functions independently of the Commission, CEO and other County officials as defined in House Bill 599.
