**ADDENDUM NO. 1**

Invitation to Bid (ITB) No. 21-101353, Asphaltic Concrete Paving Repairs (Three (3) Year Multiyear Contract) is hereby modified as follows:

1. We have received questions pertaining to this ITB. The questions and the responses are below:

a. Question: Will the contract be awarded to more than one contractor?

Answer: It is the intent of the County to award to multiple bidders, but the County reserves the right to award to a single bidder or reject any/all bids. Whatever is in the best interest of the County.

b. Question: What determines if a contract is awarded to more than one contractor?

Answer: The volume of work.

c. Question: If awarded to more than one contractor, will work be split evenly between all contractors?

Answer: The County is unable to make that determination until bids are evaluated.

d. Question: What is Dekalb County's definition of an arterial road?

Answer: Higher traffic carriers, higher traffic volumes, non-interstate.

e. Question: Will the contractor be able to perform milling operations on one day, and paving operations the 2<sup>nd</sup> day on large jobs?

Answer: No, we require milling and replacement to be performed on the same day.

f. Question: Is the after-hours work considered on-call/emergency work?

Answer: After hours cost is to be paid for work outside the normal hours requested by DeKalb County. Work performed after hours based on the contractor's request or delay will be paid with regular line items.

- g. Question: What are the hours of work for the after-hours bid items?  
Answer: Anytime after 6PM and before 7AM.
- h. Question: What are lane closure hours for the after-hours bid items?  
Answer: Lane closure hours will vary and depend on permit or municipal restrictions.
- i. Question: What is the typical size of Bid Item #1: Pothole/Utility cut patching hand work?  
Answer: This size varies with a minimum at approximately 2 feet x 2 feet.
- j. Question: What is the typical depth of Bid Item #1: Pothole/Utility cut patching hand work?  
Answer: Depth for a pothole is typically 4 inches.
- k. Question: What is the typical size of Bid Item #2: Pothole/Utility cut patching, utilizing spreader?  
Answer: A minimum of 7 feet wide extending to 600 feet long.
- l. Question: What is the typical depth of Bid Item #2: Pothole/Utility cut patching, utilizing spreader?  
Answer: 3 inches.
- m. Question: What is the typical size of Bid Item #3: Sub-Grade Work (GAB/Stone Backfill)?  
Answer: 8 inches.
- n. Question: What is the typical depth of Bid Item #3: Sub-Grade Work (GAB/Stone Backfill)?  
Answer: No typical depth, varies from 4 inches to 3 feet.
- o. Question: What is the typical depth of the roadway milling?  
Answer: Varies from 2 inches to 6 inches.
- p. Question: Are the police required for traffic control?  
Answer: Traffic control shall be in accordance with the MUTCD manual.
- q. Question: For after-hours GAB/Stone Backfill, would asphalt be allowed to be substituted for the GAB if the contractor is un-able to acquire the GAB due to rock quarry's being closed at night?  
Answer: No, the required material is compacted GAB/stone per DeKalb County Design Specifications only.
- r. Question: While performing patch work if it is discovered that subgrade work is needed, will immediate approval be obtained so that work can continue on the same day?

Answer: Subgrade work will be approved as it is discovered to avoid costly delays.

- s. Question: If it is discovered during patch work that water is still leaking, how will we be compensated for an additional mobilization?

Answer: If a leak is detected, the contractor will be compensated for their time, material and equipment on site.

- t. Question: Will traffic control be required on all patches?

Answer: Traffic control shall be in accordance with the MUTCD manual.

- 2. It is the responsibility of each bidder to ensure that he is aware of all addenda issued under this ITB. Please sign and return this addendum.
