

## RESIDENTIAL SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING PROGRAM

### 2018 Recycling Roll Cart Exchange Program Community Event



The DeKalb County Sanitation Division no longer offers 18-gallon bins and 40-gallon bags as part of the residential single-stream recycling program. A new standard 35-gallon roll cart replaces the bins and bags. Existing subscribers with 18-gallon bins must trade them in by **Dec. 28, 2018**, for a 35- or 65-gallon roll cart.

Residents are able to complete the roll cart exchange process via the online portal, by email, mail, or in person by visiting the Sanitation Division's administrative office, 3720 Leroy Scott Drive, Decatur, GA 30032, Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. - 6 p.m. A recycling subscription form must be completed for all roll cart exchange requests.
