



TUCKER WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Fact Sheet

Project Highlights

- The Tucker Water Main project will include installation of new, larger water pipe, as well as new hydrants, valves, meters and service connections. Contractors will begin assessing and preparing the impacted areas in downtown Tucker on Monday, May 14. Streets impacted will include First Avenue from Bancroft Circle to Lynburn Drive, Fourth Street from Lavista Road to Railroad Avenue, Railroad Avenue from Fourth Street to Main Street and Church Street, east of Fourth Street.
- The Tucker Water Main Replacement project is a CIP project.
- Some residents and businesses may experience temporary drops in water pressure or service disruptions as new service connections are implemented. Those impacted property owners will be notified 48 hours in advance of construction-related, water service changes.
- Lawns and pavement disturbed during the water main installation will be restored to pre-construction conditions with sod or seeded grass comparable to existing varieties.

Department Highlights:

- The DeKalb County Department of Watershed Management (DWM) was established in 1942.
- Through planning, operation, maintenance and monitoring, DWM helps provide clean, safe drinking water and quality wastewater treatment year round.
- DeKalb County is replacing outdated water and sewer lines throughout the county under a \$1.345 billion Capital Improvement Program (CIP).
- DWM services over 5,000 miles of pipe that comprise the county's water and wastewater systems.
- Many of DeKalb County's water and sewer pipes are being replaced because they have exceeded their service life.
