



REQUIRED ITEMS for PLAN SUBMITTAL for FIRE MARSHAL REVIEW

Submit plans with Architect's/Engineer's seal for all plans over 5,000 sq. ft., greater than three stories, or all A, E, and I occupancies. All plumbing, mechanical and electrical plans must be stamped by a design professional. All plans submitted to DeKalb County Planning and Sustainability for structural Plans Review must also be reviewed for zoning compliance and site development before a permit will be issued. All plans relating to the Food Service Industry (restaurant, motels, hotels, personal care homes, or child care facilities, etc.) must be reviewed by the County Health Department before reviewed by Structural Plans Review. All plans must be submitted to Plan Review in triplicate along with two (2) copies of a permit application. The applicant will be notified once the review is completed. At this time, the permit is ready to be issued and should be picked up within two weeks. To eliminate confusion, please remember your plan review file number.

To facilitate review and approval:

- □ Plans must bear seal of currently GEORGIA licensed Architect and/or Engineer (See OCG 43-15-24 for additional information).
- □ Plans must be to standard architectural scale (preferably ¼ " = 1' or larger), on <u>MINIMUM 24"x 36"</u> (Engineering or ANSI-C Size) sheets of paper.
- □ There must be two (2) sets of architectural plans which consist of architectural, Mechanical, site, plumbing and electrical drawings.
 - Fire protection systems require submittal of three (3) complete sets of plans.
- \Box Plans shall be accompanied by one copy of specifications.
- □ Contractors for project must be currently GEORGIA licensed low-voltage or fire suppression (hood, sprinkler) and must submit individual fire alarm or fire suppression system designs for review.
- □ The plans shall indicate ALL CODES and STANDARDS used in design. (Ex: "This facility was designed in accordance with 2012 NFPA 101- Life Safety Code"; or "This facility was designed in accordance with 2013 NFPA 72-Fire Alarm Systems".)

- □ The plan shall include manufacturer's installation instructions for equipment, including equipment descriptions, applications, and limitations of listing. (Ex: Paint spray booths, fire dampers, heat/smoke vents, etc).
- □ All plans for hospitals, detention facilities, and any state owned/operated/occupied facilities must be approved by the Georgia State Safety Fire Commissioners Office prior to submittal of those plans to DeKalb County.

When applicable, the following items that pertain to the facility design MUST BE SHOWN on the drawings:

- 1) Name of owner and/or occupant
- ____2) Location, including proper street address (to include Suite/Unit number)
- ____3) Legend for ALL symbols
- 4) Site plan showing relative elevations and illustrating driveways, fire department access roads, parking, handicap parking, proximity of structure to other structures, distance of structure from other structures, walkways, ramps, stairs, fences, passenger loading zones, location of electric transformer pads, heat and air conditioning units outside of the facility.
- ____5) Construction Type, with specified reference to EITHER 2012 IBC or 2012 NFPA 220 (as modified on GAC 120-3-20, NFPA 101 Table 8.2.1.1). Note construction materials and components of the structure on the plans (i.e. load bearing walls, interior walls, columns, etc).
- ____6) Occupancy Type
- ____7) Occupant Load WITH calculations (per N.F.P.A. 101)
- 8) Capacity (as identified by the authorities having jurisdiction, such as the DeKalb County School Board).
 - _9) Dimension of all rooms
- ____10) Label all rooms and their uses.
- 11) Dimensions of all bathrooms (New construction MUST COMPLY with GA Accessibility Code, 1997, GAC 120-3-20 requirements) and ADA Standards for Accessible Design. Show clearances,
 - turning circles, elevations all fixtures).
- ____12) Location and size of ALL doors, door widths, corridors, and windows with sill height (provide details for clarity). Include class/rating for doors and windows, with UL listing. Indicate door swings, length of halls and corridors, and travel distances to exits.
- ____13) Location of fire alarm components to include pull stations, horn/strobe units and fire alarm control panel, battery calculations and strobe intensity levels. Fire Alarm Plans MUST be submitted by GEORGIA licensed low-voltage contractor.
 - __14) Location and power sources for ALL smoke detectors.
- ____15) Locations of ALL exit signs.
- ____16) Location of all emergency lighting.
- 17) Locations of fire extinguishers (Note size, type and rating).

- 18) Location of furnaces and water heaters. If unit is in attic/penthouse, note the location. Note BTU input rating of hot water heaters, and note CFM and BTU of furnace.
- ____19) Location and type of stove (residential or commercial appliance).
- ____20) Location of ALL stairs (inside and outside), ramps, and slope of ramps (Ex: 1:12)
- ____21) Show building cross section (drawing of outside of building) with elevation(s) related to grade.
- ____22) Location and size of laundry room (number, type residential or commercial appliance).
- 23) Note location of storage room, with type/commodity and height of contents. For high-piled combustible storage, plans MUST contain ALL information required in IFC Chap. 23 (3201.3 Construction Documents).
- ____24) Indicate location of any powered industrial material handling equipment (Ex: LP Gas or Electric powered forklift trucks, inside or outside)
- ___25) Location of fixed fire protection devices (Ex: kitchen hood suppression or Sprinkler systems). System design must be done and submitted by GEORGIA licensed fire suppression or sprinkler contractor.
