ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Motion by Ms. Smith and seconded by Mr. Lewis to adopt the June 25, 2020 special called meeting minutes. Motion carries by unanimous vote.

Motion by Ms. Smith and seconded by Mr. Lewis to adopt the June 29, 2020 special called meeting minutes. Motion carries by unanimous vote.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Smith requested that the Board read public comments into the record during the meeting or alternatively, allow public comments during the meeting.

Mr. Tillman read the rules for public comment.

Public comment may be submitted by sending an email of one page or less to Electionspubliccmnt@dekalbcountyga.gov which must be received between 4:330 PM and 5:0 PM on the day of the meeting. The body of your email must include your first and last name, followed by your address. Abusive, profane, or derogatory language will not be permitted. By submitting an email for public comment, you agree to have your name, address and the email broadcast on the UStream and entered into the record and minutes. The DeKalb Board of Registration and Elections reserves the right, at the DeKalb Board of Registration and Elections' sole discretion, to (1) add your email to the record/minutes without reading any of it into the broadcast or (2) read all or a portion of your email into the record/minutes. The Public Comments received are attached and hereby incorporated into these minutes by reference. See attachment(s).

NEW BUSINESS

A) Additional Runoff Advanced Voting Locations

Ms. Motter stated that a number of voters and elected officials have contacted her asking that Tucker Library and Stonecrest be added as additional early voting locations. Motion by Ms. Motter and seconded by Ms. Smith that the Board approve Tucker Library and Stonecrest as additional early voting locations.

The Board discussed whether early voting should be for two weeks or for one week at these additional locations. Also, the Board considered expanding voting locations in the western part of the county.

Motion by Ms. Motter and seconded by Mr. Vu to approve two additional early voting locations at Tucker Library and Stonecrest for two weeks. Motion carries by unanimous vote.

B) Discussion and Adoption of a Resolution for the DeKalb County VRE Implementation Plan

Ms. Hamilton discussed the concerns in the auditor's report and described projects that have already been implemented. Mr. Vu presented three (3) resolutions related to the implementation plan:

- (1) The Board of Registration and Elections accepts the final report recommendations dated May 29, 2020, and approves and resolves to implement recommendations in the three-month implementation plan previously presented to the Board in time for the November 2020 General Election;
- (2) The Board of Registration and Elections approves the hiring of an external consulting group to plan, scale up, and manage the end-to-end Vote-by- Mail process and operations for the November 3 General Election, in cooperation with the Director and with an appropriate resource ask from the County Commission; and
- (3) The Board of Registration and Elections will immediately contract with or hire a full-time communications professional, to plan and implement a voter out-reach and communications plan for the November 2020 General Election.

The Board discussed department needs with respect to staffing and resources in consideration of the above resolutions.

Motion by Ms. Smith and seconded by Mr. Lewis that the Board will immediately contract with or hire a full-time communications professional, to plan and implement a voter out-reach and communications plan for the November 3, 2020 General Election in cooperation with the Director. Motion carries by unanimous vote.

Motion by Ms. Smith and seconded by Mr. Vu that the Board accepts the final report recommendations dated May 29, 2020, and approves and resolves to implement recommendations in the three-month implementation plan previously presented to the Board in time for the November 2020 General Election; with the exception of item 1(a) from the executive summary. Motion carries 3-2. Mr. Lewis and Mr. Tillman both vote nay.

Motion by Mr. Vu and seconded by Mr. Lewis that the discussion of the second resolution be tabled for a special called meeting on Thursday, July 16 at 4:00 p.m. Motion carries by unanimous vote.

C) Absentee Ballot Applications for the November 3, 2020 General Election

Ms. Hamilton asked that the department take on the responsibility of mailing requests for absentee ballots because the Secretary of State Office will not be sending these applications for the November election. Motion by Ms. Motter and seconded by Ms. Smith that the DeKalb Elections Office send out absentee ballot applications to all voters who are registered in DeKalb County, with

an appropriate ask from the County Commission to implement this program. Motion carries by unanimous vote.

COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

Commissioner Larry Johnson asked that all approved agenda items and Ms. Hamilton's report be presented to the Board of Commissioners at their July 14 meeting.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Hamilton reported that another employee has tested positive for COVID-19 and that the office has been sanitized again. The employees that have tested positive will not be allowed to return until they test negative. The department is limiting the number of people in the office and those who can work from home will be working remotely until it is safe to return to the office.

Dear Members of the Commission:

My name is Michael Evans from 895 Derrydown Way in Decatur. I <u>read</u> about the commission's resolution requesting that the Georgia General Assembly look into online voting as a solution to our challenge with administering elections amid the pandemic.

As a citizen of the county, a political scientist, and a citizen of Georgia committed to voting rights and therefore improving election administration in this county and state, I find this resolution deeply concerning for two reasons.

First, this is a solution worse than the problem. <u>The consensus among cybersecurity experts is</u> that online voting cannot be secured from hacking. Online voting would be convenient and safe

from COVID, but unfortunately it cannot provide trust in our democratic process. We need to not only cast our votes, but also to be confident our votes are counted and that malicious actors are not sabotaging our democratic elections.

Second, this suggests to me that Dekalb is taking its eye off the ball when it comes to finding real solutions to our election administration problems. Even before COVID, as you know, we have had major issues with how our elections are administered. COVID has made it worse. But the only solution is to get real about modernizing our system. We need to build capacity to process absentee ballots and have a nonpartisan campaign to strongly encourage absentee voting. We also need to recruit and train young poll workers to staff our early voting and Election Day polling places.

I am working with a former student on a program called "Push for 5k." Our goal is to help five counties--Fulton, Gwinnett, Cobb, Clayton, and Dekalb--hire and train 5,000 student poll workers and/or absentee-ballot-counters for the upcoming general election. So far, four out of those five counties have enthusiastically embraced our initiative and are working with us to prepare for fall. Unfortunately, Dekalb has so far been completely uncooperative. This is also consistent with my experience when I applied to be a poll worker back in February. I still have not heard back from the county regarding my application. I know at least two other citizens of this county who have had the same experience. This leaves me wondering how many other citizens have attempted to serve as election workers during this emergency, only to be ignored. This is hard to understand when we are facing worker shortages.

Long lines are a product of worker shortages and malfunctioning voting machines. I am a proponent of hand marked paper ballots so that the latter will no longer be an issue. I realize we are stuck with our machines for the time being. But in the meantime we can at least try to address the worker shortage problem while also encouraging hand marked absentee ballots.

I hope you will lead an effort to get real about improving our elections and no longer waste precious time with a non-solution like online voting. If I can be of service in this effort, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Public Comment #18

I'm Joy Wasson, a DeKalb voter and I appreciate the very challenging work you all do. As a poll watcher and election integrity advocate, I have a few suggestions.

Preparedness on a very basic level needs to be stepped up. A frantic poll worker asked me for a pen on election morning because there were none supplied at Antioch AME where I was observing. Voters had been waiting 2 hours, and— with all equipment down— no one had voted at all until complaints seemed to prompt the voting on provisional paper ballots. It should not have been provisional ballots, but rather emergency ballots (not requiring curing), if only voters could have been verified by an **updated paper backup to the poll pad**.

Before election morning, precinct records could be updated from absentee and early voting information, and printed out, thus allowing voters to mark a regular ballot that can be scanned (then or later) without further verification needed. Supplies at the polls—such as enough ballots—will need to be on hand, not to mention pens to mark the ballots. You cannot rely solely on tech support to come to the rescue as it hasn't worked in the past and you never know whether power outages or some other problem makes machine voting impossible. No one should ever stand in line for hours with no voting taking place. Since you are planning to use the equipment, more poll pads must be deployed as they are the first roadblock to efficient voting. Again, the certified, updated electors list as a backup to poll books can help speed the process, even being used as an additional check in station. Early voting not only needs to be increased, but it needs to be equitable and in place in communities where the demand is not being met. There shouldn't be communities that never have a wait and communities that always have a wait.

As I mentioned at the recent DeKalb Voter Experience Forum, the **processing and adjudication of absentee ballots** needs to be improved. The software & scanners have been discovered to be overlooking clearly marked votes. The software must be set to catch overvotes but not to filter other marks so that **every legitimate vote is counted**. You also may have **multiple vote review panels** to avoid the unfortunate situation of reviewers working way too many hours. Especially given our COVID-19 situation, the time workers are indoors together should be limited. Observers during absentee ballot processing must be welcomed and the **public must be allowed to see the entire process** to ensure there is confidence in the results. The outside consultants talked about this kind of transparency in their report.

I look forward to your taking the suggestions of the outside consultants and implementing as many of them as you can. Hiring someone to help with **communications should be a priority**. It would be great if DCTV would post the videos of these meetings afterwards as they do routinely for BOC meetings. I want DeKalb Elections to have the resources and support it needs. Please use this opportunity with the backing of so many in our county **to request what you need to succeed**.

- 2. Hire a communications professional to develop and implement a comprehensive voter outreach and communication plan. This is especially critical as we know there are attempts to misinform the public and undermine their confidence in the vote by mail process. It is also necessary to ensure accurate information regarding emergency polling places are communicated to voters leading up to Election Day.
- 3. Hire an external consulting group to plan and implement an end-to-end vote by mail process for the November 3rd General Election. It is clear that Georgia has not contained COVID-19 and the BRE must ensure that every voter that wishes to vote from the safety of their home is able to do so in a timely manner.

As a final note, I also strongly urge the BRE to take time to read public comments into the record during virtual meetings. DeKalb's citizens deserve to know that the BRE is listening to our voices, even when we cannot speak in person.

Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. The League of Women Voters stands ready to assist DeKalb to ensure all DeKalb voters have full and equal access to the ballot box in the upcoming elections.

Dear Board members:

We saw long lines, closed polling locations, and malfunctioning equipment on June 9th. Poll workers had to risk COVID exposure to accommodate the crowds. If voter turnout is anywhere near predicted levels, DeKalb will not be able to accommodate all voters on November 3rd.

Some demand can be eased by providing more equipment, better trained poll workers, and public campaigns to get people to vote early – but those will only go so far. Mail voting has the most potential. Even though Raffensperger's Vote by Mail campaign was rolled out at the last

minute, DeKalb's absentee rate grew from under 7% of ballots in the 2018 Governor's race to 44% of Presidential votes in the June 9th General Primary.

DeKalb should seize this momentum and send applications to all active voters. This will ease demands for poll workers (who might quit at the last minute), polling places (which might cancel contracts at the last minute), and reduce the need for LAT and transportation of complex, bulky voting machines.

You have an opportunity to hire a communications professional, as described in the 3-month plan, to promote mail voting. That person could work with community groups and harness social media channels. They could give voters a time frame for returning ballot applications and ballots so citizens don't phone the elections office so much. A communications professional could reassure voters that absentee ballots will be counted accurately, and help build trust by inviting public observation of ballot processing.

Printing and postage might seem expensive, but the savings on poll worker salaries, rent, and transportation would be considerable. The board should demand a thorough comparison between mailing applications or accommodating overwhelming crowds in November.

Hello,

My husband and I moved from Miami, FL to Atlanta in March 2020. The primary on June 9, 2020 was our first voting experience in the state of Georgia.

The absentee ballot/vote by mail request process in DeKalb County is clunky, antiquated and inconvenient.

□One, it requires that voters have access to a printer to print and then fax/mail the form. We have a printer but not everyone does.

□Two, once forms are submitted to the email address/fax number provided by the county, voters receive no confirmation that requests were actually received by the Elections office.

The lack of acknowledgement only serves to confuse voters like me who may then have to call the office to engage the staff in verifying whether or not requests were indeed received. This is a waste of time for both voters and staff.

In Miami Dade County, registered voters can request their vote by mail ballots on the county elections site or they may call the office and request their ballot over the phone. There is no added paperwork or steps and their office sends the voter a confirmation of the request. It's simple, fast and easy.
