


What is the PATH Foundation?

- Plans, designs and builds trails for many communities
- 320+ miles of trails built to date
- Raised \$65M private to match \$255M public



PATH Trails in DeKalb County and City of Atlanta

What are Greenways?





- Linear parks designed for pedestrians, bicyclists and wheelchair users
- Completely separated from vehicular traffic
- Provides a highly attractive and safe trail user experience

What are Sidepaths?

- Roadway-adjacent facility designed for pedestrians, bicyclists and wheelchair users
- Separated from traffic except at vehicle crossings
- Provides a safe and attractive trail user experience







Planning Process

Measurable Goals of the Trail Study

- Partner with community to propose a high-quality trail for District 1
- Reconnect neighborhoods separated by interstates
- Enable alternative transportation options to key destinations and to the future regional trail network

Desired Outcomes of the Project


- Provide neighbors access to the unique ecological areas of Mercer's campus.
- Enhance physical, mental, and social health through outdoor recreation
- Empower people with mobility challenges to enjoy the benefits of trails and natural areas
- Educate residents, workers, and students of all ages about their environment
- Identify and address the privacy and security of residents who live near trails





Trail Study Area - Key Destinations




How Many Could Access Proposed Trails?

3 SUMMARY OF FEEDBACK TO DATE

Summary of Feedback

Benefits of proposed trail

- Nature access
- Place to safely walk, bike or run
- Get around without driving

"This is an absolutely incredible opportunity for meaningful pedestrian connections in our area."

Concerns about proposed trail

- Increased crime
- Loss of privacy
- Damage to environment
- Benefit to community

"This is absolutely horrible. We do not want this behind our home. We like privacy and safety."

Summary of Responses to Concerns

Increased crime

- DeKalb Police: "We do not foresee an uptick in property crime as a result of this [Mercer] trail."
- Chamblee Parks Police: "More people means more eyes means less crime."

Loss of privacy

- Avg. 350' between homes and proposed trail on HM Creek
- Other trail segments haven't generated this concern



DeKalb County Environmental Assessment

DeKalb County recognizes its responsibility to protect the County's natural resources

DeKalb Environmental/Ecological Assessment

- Tree Canopy
- Floodplains/Wetlands: Water Quality and Quantity
- Habitat

Special Permitting by Local/State/Federal Issuing Authorities

- Federal/State/DeKalb County Stream Buffer Encroachment
- FEMA Floodplain / Floodway
- Wetlands impacts


PATH Top-Down Construction Methods

- Minimal tree impact
- Minimal land disturbance
- Trail stays above while wildlife, nutrients and water pass beneath




Possible Trail Opportunities

A shift to the south side of creek would


- Leverage sewer alignment (easier to build)
- Avoid wetland on north side of creek
- Access office properties and still have inviting trail experience




