
DeKalb County 2050 Unified Plan

What is the Plan?

The Unified Plan brings two major disciplines (transportation and land use) together for a more seamless strategy for better coordination of future development. The Unified Plan will go beyond the DCA mandated elements by including sensitive growth issues such as Arts and Culture, Comprehensive housing strategy, Smart streets, and resiliency. The Unified Plan gives DeKalb County a blue print for an Implementation Program for future capital investments directly linked to the county's vision and an improved quality of life.

Current schedule is simply development of accomplishments and no new policy direction.
