



DCFR Helps with the Fight Against COVID-19

- Maintained operational readiness by adhering to CEO's directives and CDC guidelines
 - Created model COVID-19 tracking and tracing program
- 2021: Graduated 45 fire rescue recruits who assisted with 11 Covid-19 vaccination events, 18 food distribution events and 5 COVID care packaging events
- 2021: EMS Division assisted the BOH with administering over 13,000 COVID-19
 vaccinations at county sponsored mass vaccination clinics and the Homebound program.

DCFR Performance

- Fire/EMS Operations
 - "First-on-Scene Model of Care" approach
 - Data Reporting Enhancements Ex: Reduction in Turnout Time
 - Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) / Emergency Fire Dispatch (EFD)
- Fire Marshal Office (2021)
 - Fire Inspectors completed **7,845 inspections**
 - Fire Plan Reviewers assigned to FMO completed 1,237 fire plan reviews
 - Fire Investigators investigated 305 fires made 32 arrests
- \$14,000,000 in Grant Funding (mostly through Competitive processes)
 - 75 Firefighter Positions funded through SAFER
 - Health & Wellness Screening
 - Behavior Health Training
 - Paramedic Program

Nurse Navigation Debuted in October 2020

- Unique service offering from AMR/GMR in select communities
- Designed to route lower acuity 911 calls to appropriate resources
- Over 8,000 calls routed to RN since program began



SPLOST Enhancements

- Fire Station Construction \$41.1 Million
- Fire Station Repairs \$3.1 Million
- Fire Radio Upgrades \$1.5 Million
- Rapid Response Vehicle Units\$2 Million
