II. DISCUSSION

ARP Funding Budget Discussion

-discussion not heard in committee

Minimum Average Starting Salaries for Public Safety

-information provided by Director Ransom

-Question TT: will you also discuss other benefits other than salary?

Director Ransom: today we are taking into consideration salary, rather than pension and benefits

-Question JR: does the Administration plan to keep hazard pay?

Z Williams: we are constantly reviewing; we have not positioned ourselves to change at this moment. We have continued to react and scale back where we felt that we could.

-Question JR: Could you provide justification for ongoing hazard pay since it seems that we are the only metro jurisdiction doing that?

Z Williams: we would be happy to; we have shown that we have been a leader in regards to response

-Question TT: what does the opportunity for advancement look like once you are on the police force?

Z Williams: about 4 years ago, we dealt with increasing the salaries of the master officer, and ensuring take home vehicles. It is around the 5 year mark that jurisdictions begin losing officers. Staffing in the labor market is tight; this is an employees' market. Many times it is not just about the money.

-MDJ: can we discuss retirement?

Z Williams: there is not a separate retirement system for public safety, however that is a different conversation -Question LJ: what did you decide to do with the minimum?

Z Williams: we don't currently have a proposal to take action on the minimums; what we have shown is that we are competitive due to incentives like the incentives pay and front-line pay. We are still in conversations with the Sheriff as to what would happen within her budget.

-Question LJ: Ms. Ransom are you satisfied with this package that we offer? Do you know why some officers are leaving? Director Ransom: we haven't examined why people leave; we can say that we have a competitive salary package. In many instances we lead the market.

-MDJ: that is something we can address in the near future regarding why public safety personnel leave. We can bring it back up again regarding retention and exit reasons.

Z Williams; this conversation will reach beyond public safety; other departments have had challenges staffing MDJ: we can bring both in future ERPS committee meetings; we will get with you all to see if we can schedule that. -Question LCJ: will we be able to sustain the incentives we currently offer? Can we get an assessment of the exit interviews from personnel that can be shared with commissioners? MDJ: we will have further discussion on this
