II. DISCUSSION

Fund Balance Reserve Policy

-presentation provided by CFO McNabb, Elise Lomel of PFM
-Question TT: if we were to do a 3 month reserve, it seems that may take a while to get to. Is there contemplation of adoption of a policy, with an aspirational goal based on economic criteria?

*E Lomel: many of the policies we reviewed had a minimum fund and a goal level as well* 

*-Question TT: are there projections on what it would take to get above two months?* 

CFO McNabb: we don't have projections at this point in time; the gradual step up could be set as goals. Also what needs to be included in that policy, is that if there needs to be a draw on that fund balance, exactly how it will be replenished over a number of years. -Question TT: regarding Cobb, Fayette, Forsyth, and Gwinnett, you mentioned they are AAA rated. Did you highlight them because rating agencies appreciate that?

-Question TT: we approved our Stormwater utility fund rates this morning. There is the goal to get to \$10.5M reserve balance in that fund. What does that represent if we get to that goal of operating in the time period?

*D McNabb*: that would be more like 4 month; additional comments provided by CFO McNabb

-Question LCJ: what is our current surplus fund balance?

TJ Sigler: for the 2023 budget, the ending fund balance for tax funds is \$148 million. I believe that is 2.1 months

-Question LCJ: those that had AAA rating all had 3 months correct?

D McNabb: correct that was their policy, many of them higher than that

-LCJ: someone should be in charge of the plan to get us to 3 months; in the words of CEO Thurmond we've taken the training wheels off the bike. I would like to see what it would take to get us to the 3+ month fund balance to be in line with those who are AAA rated, and for you COO Williams to report back on the action that is necessary

-TT: I would like to do a follow up meeting with you CFO McNabb and PFM for my additional questions

-Question TT: maybe this is the time to formalize the 2 months reserve policy; I wonder that by just adopting where we already are could be a positive mark for where we will be in the following years. As we work on an aspirational goal in that direction I would be inclined to further discuss how the other fund amounts play into the goal of AAA bond rating. I would also be interested to see how the EHOST reserves fit into this

-presentation provided Claudia Saari, DeKalb Public Defender -Question RP: is there a service that links from what police body cameras are to your office to the DA's office to where a link can be sent, rather than the data being downloaded? Is there a secure storage place? -response provided by Public Defender Saari -Question RP: if there's any physical documents produced, are you able to scan those electronically and dispose of the hard copies? C Saari: yes in 2019 we began storing client files electronically. Additional information provided by Ms. Saari -Question RP: you have how many pending homicides? C Saari: currently 270 pending homicides; that is due primarily to the COVID-19 pandemic and the courts backlog -Question TT: in terms of the trends, are those trends holding where you are having more open than closed from the last 5 months? So the load is getting larger? C Saari: yes that's correct -Question TT: how are you doing regarding your vacancies and filling of positions? C Saari: that is helping tremendously; we don't have any vacancies at this particular time. DeKalb pay scale is not as large as Fulton County's and that is our largest competitor -Question TT: regarding the quality of work environment, do you have any feedback from your employees regarding non-salary related benefits that make working in DeKalb a more attractive place? C Saari: a hybrid work policy is very valued by employees; the other feedback that we get is professional development and the opportunity to grow -Question TT: does your office take advantage of tuition reimbursement? C Saari: no because it has to be within our budget; it would have to be added within our budget -Question TT: COO Williams could you provide more information on the storage of the data? -response provided by COO Williams -Question SB: what has kept you here 36 years? -responses provided by Public Defender Saari -Question SB: what is the size of your operating budget? C Saari: \$16.1M -Question SB: you mentioned winning a case before the US Supreme Court? Can you elaborate on that? -responses provided by Public Defender Saari
