-Commissioner Terry requested further information on the board budget and the DeKalb Elections Committee -D Lowman Smith: regarding the budget, we are getting about double what the most recent budget was. We have been discussing getting the department up to the appropriate funding level, and we are working with HR to ensure we have the appropriate staffing and organizational structure to become one of the leading elections operators in the southeast. You can expect additional position requests as we get clarity around that. We are trying to model ourselves around best practice organizations. Regarding the stakeholder committee, one of Ms. Smith's charges will be to look into how we can incorporate that collaboration and communication in the day-to-day. We have since brought on a consultant on communications and marketing to keep our stakeholders apprised; we feel that we are on the right path and look forward to Ms. Smith's recommendations on how we can integrate that into what we do, rather than have something separate -MDJ: myself and Commissioner Patrick will hold a 6:30PM Thursday, February 3rd event will be a voter education town hall meeting, where we I'll be introducing our new board members.  A Resolution Of The Governing Authority of DeKalb County Requesting That The DeKalb Delegation Of The General Assembly Support Legislation to Amend The Georgia Elections Code To Allow Counties To Use Instant Runoff or "Rank Choice" Voting in Local Elections

-information provided by Commissioner Rader -Question MDJ: how would this affect the rank choice in the state of Georgia's system? JR: it doesn't change the necessity to change the 50%+1 to have the election. What is does is upon the elimination of candidates in a particular election, if a single candidate achieves 50+1 at the general election, they are elected. If no candidate receives that 50+1 in the general election, rather than go to a runoff election, the lowest ranked candidate would be eliminated and their votes reallocated to the second candidate. The process works it way through for each candidate after if that does not result in a 50+1 for one candidate. -information provided by Bill Bozarth -B Bozarth: discussion of HB 1085, sponsored by 6 legislators, 2 of which are representatives from DeKalb. The lead sponsor is a republican. This is a bipartisan effort. This resolution would put DeKalb in the position that you would like this to happen to be a choice in the county. -Question TT: has there been a study committee convened? B Bozarth: there has not yet been a study committee convened in the legislature -discussion of benefits of a ranked choice system by Commissioner Terry -TT: if this study committee happens, and they look at it from a comprehensive view, there would be uniformity that we get the study committee going so that we can particularly review the cost savings -Question MDJ: does HB 1085 that is the bill to put the counties and municipalities on equal footing when determining the type of runoffs you desire? B Bozarth: the bill was drafted based on what could be accomplished. The legislation being discussed by Commissioner Terry is what Better Ballot Georgia believes the state needs to do; it does not include counties currently, so down the line counties would need to be added to this - only cities. -Question SB: I don't think the electorate is well served by a candidate debate stage with several 8-10 candidates battling on stage. When it is 1-1 you get to see the candidate and their ability to work under pressure; but if this is to convene a study committee then I am on board with that -RP: having been through a runoff, it is an opportunity for residents to see what you have as a candidate; I'm not sure I see the immediate benefit but I can get behind the study committee

-Question MDJ :commissioner Rader is this study committee only going to study the cost factor, or other factors? JR: this does not single out costs, so the committee would have a broader charge than studying costs; the real focus needs to be some of the factors that Commissioners have expressed regarding public will and best way to manifest that. That is more to the point of what ranked choice voting is intended to do

-Question MDJ: is it your position that any flexibility should be taken out of the procurement process?

JR: not necessarily. Additional information provided by Commissioner Rader. The adoption of an ordinance does not remove all executive flexibility; it identifies those areas where flexibility is formalized in order to make all parties accountable. This was not perfected in the legislation previously adopted, so this attempts to correct that defect in the legislation

-Question SB: for clarity, what is different now from the original ruling that this change couldn't be made without a referendum? JR: nothing has changed; this is a resolution to petition the delegation to correct the flaw that was identified. It doesn't have any other problems sought to be addressed. This simply says that there is that flaw in the existing legislation that needs to be corrected

-Question SB: in a practical sense, does this encroach on the current authority of the chief executive?

JR: that is supposedly the issue that the county attorney identified; the legislation that the General Assembly adopted had that effect and therefore required a referendum.

-question RP: as I read this it seems that we are asking the legislation to fix the problem; would it not be better to suggest what we want?

JR: The focus on the construction is to draw that defect to their attention

-MDJ: I would like to have further discussions on this in committee. I have questions on it and am not ready to proceed with it

-SB: I'm not ready to take action on 3530, and the 2 successive items. I believe that all 3 of these should be taken in the construct of an overall charter review

Z Williams: the discussion of the charter review board appointee will be coming soon as the CEO is working on bringing that forward
