-Question JR: it seems there are a lot of empty grocery boxes across the county. I wonder what has changed to make them no longer viable as grocery stores and what might be done to bring tenants back to those grocery stores?

-*M* Freehill: they are occupied by stores that are not able to handle the same footprint - for example Big Bear Market; that is not what the modern grocery shopper necessarily wants to see. Additional information provided by Ms. Freehill
