C Ellis: it depends on the value of the project; other times we may do piggybacking. It all depends on the actual project. If we have specifics on the design, construction, it may go through an ITB for instance. We try to do it in the most efficient way that will cost us the least amount of time -Question MLS: if you do an RFQ before an RFP, how much time does that add to the process? C Ellis: every project is so different it would be hard to give an answer on that -Question LJ: between RFP, RFQ, and design build, do any of the projects fall under design-build? C Ellis: yes it depends on the type of project, we always think of that possibility. That determination is made after it comes out of permitting -Question MLS: regarding the cemetery project, is it countywide? C Ellis: that's correct -LJ: continue to bring this back; hopefully from COO Williams we get the CIP funding attached to these projects so we can keep things moving. By July and Parks Month you have a good report to share in each of the parks in our area.
