#### II. STATUS UPDATE

CIP Definition and Funding Report

-presentation from Reggie Wells, Director Watershed Management

Water Meter Presentation

-Question LCJ: With the New Day Project how many water meters were we replacing?

R Wells: The original plan when deployed was 102,000

-Question LCJ: are our reading electronically done?

R Wells: yes, we currently have over 130,000 customers within advance meter infrastructure (AMI), and we are working to get the remaining 35,000 customers done electronically to serve our customers with informed data

-Question LCJ: When did the New Day Project begin?

R Wells: the commitment began in 2017, the settlement happened in 2018, and the operation began in 2019

-Question TT: What are the leading causes for unexpected high meter bills?

R Wells: in the past the main contributing factor to unexpected high water bills was the misalignment between the device in the field and its setup in the billing system. Today, the most common issue experienced has been more of the customer having shock after getting a new meter replacement that now measures consumption/usage.

- -Question TT: Do we have a program that alerts customer service reps of issues experienced in the field?
- -R Wells: we do. Mr. Wells referred to presentation snapshot of data capturing system within the AMI
- -Question TT: are there options for an irrigation meter? What is the policy on that?

R Wells: we use the same type of meter. When irrigation is used, the user only pays the irrigation rate, and not the sewer rate. We use the same type of metering device and AMI technology. The cost for a second irrigation meter is mostly around the construction of the meter and infrastructure, around \$2000. This is due to the logistics involved around installing the meter. The meter itself is around \$110.

-Question RP: what is the process for routine payment arrangements for outstanding bills? Response provided from COO Williams

-R Wells: next step is to lift the billing moratorium that has been in place

R Wells: many factors drive the effectiveness of the motors; if the alignment is good you will get more usage out of them -Question RP: what happens with the parts that are out of commission?

R Wells: We pull them if normal wear and tear; we also do an analysis with the vendor to determine next steps, for instance a warranty.
