II. STATUS UPDATE

CIP Update

-information provided by interim director Hayes, Cassandra Marshall regarding the Consent Decree and CIP -Question RP: it was stated that we are at 905,000 linear feet of simple pipe review. What is the total and how close are we to completion?

C Marshall: The 905,000 is what we plan to have completed by the end of the year. 780,000 is completed to date, and I believe the total is a little over 1,000,050.

-Question RP: So perhaps by the first quarter of next year, this component will be finished with this simple pipe review? C Marshall: that is correct

-LCJ: I believe that is line with the projections, because we were to do 10%-20% annually, and with the date that we started, I believe through 2022, that would give us the first 5 years.

-Question TT: for the gravity sewer assessment for the smoking acoustic testing and closed circuit, is that ongoing? Will we keep doing this as a regular cycle? How does it look going forward?

D Hayes: yes sir, we have an ongoing assessment to assess a certain portion of our sewer system every year. As those assessments are done, we prioritize hotspots and areas of concern accordingly.

III. DISCUSSION

County Road Repairs

-information provided by Director Lemke

-Question LCJ: when were the estimates gathered by the County of the total cost road repairs you are referring to? R Lemke: the original estimates were likely prepared by the County at the time those bonds were collected. They may be 8-10 years old.

-Question LCJ: do we have a priority list that we are working down regarding completing these 39 streets? Are there established timelines? I assume we are intertwining them with our SPLOST allocations.

R Lemke: these are not being performed as part of the SPLOST resurfacing program; these are being performed with our oncall contractors separate from SPLOST. Currently the only funding sources is the surety bonds that the County has collected but that is not nearly enough for full completion. The timeline is difficult to provide because I know we don't have the money currently allocated to complete this. We are looking for other funding sources and have reached out to GDOT to explore LMIG funding as well; I doubt it would qualify for LMIG because it is more for maintenance rather than new construction, and they would consider this new construction because the streets weren't completed to begin with. We are reviewing how we can accomplish getting all of the streets completed. We may need to come back to the BOC and request a separate allocation to continue this work.

-LCJ: I believe that is where we are headed. I thank you for the clarity, because currently all we have from the surety bonds is \$1.2M; I still believe we need a priority list

-LJ: these residents that are waiting on their streets to be paved they are homeowners and taxpayers; some of the developers may have changed their names and may now be operating under another LLC; we need to find out where they are and collect. We also don't need to continue to kick this can down the road; the longer we wait the more it will cost. Zach does the new infrastructure money include roads that you can pave? We need to look at opportunities to move forward as soon as possible. -LCJ: we will look to COO Williams to develop a plan as it relates to what pots of money that this type work would be covered. How would these dollars be allocated?

-Question RP: how many parcels of land are we discussing being affected?

R Lemke: I would have to review the particular quantity.

ARP Funding Budget

-TT: I believe there was funding for septic to sewer. Are there any urgent items as it relates to PWI? M Houser: yes one of the items addresses water/sewer infrastructure; we are working on developing the MOU with another entity to manage the program. We could bring this back in 2 weeks if the committee desires Z Williams: we will need a MOU for the Board to approve separately once the Board approves the allocation -Question LJ: are you attempting to tailor this program uniquely to DeKalb or modeling after others? Z Williams: we are utilizing modeling done in Atlanta and best practices from other jurisdictions. It is a compilation of a number of things for these programs. We can have this back in 2 weeks, and hopefully a MOU for review. -LCJ: We will bring this back in 2 weeks, along with the MOU for review Z Williams: That includes the MOU items, as well as stormwater funding

-Question TT: how do we treat the repaying and restriping for pedestrian bicycle standards?

LCJ: the item before us is strictly for resurfacing. Striping was passed the last week of July; I would refer back to that item as it relates to road striping. Regarding enhancing the aesthetic of the roads, that would be for a separate conversation. Z Williams: Commissioner Terry is on point; at the outset of the SPLOST program we have attempted to stay on point with road repaving; we look to transform the entire area as it relates to beautification, signs, etc. The BOC approved with the mid-year budget more funding for beautification efforts.

-LCJ: I think we need to bring back that beautification back to committee as a separate conversation. Also, the County does not pay for edging. We need to address this. Let's bring this back so that we can bring back this discussion. Often we work with GDOT so that we can be cohesive and also have savings opportunities.

Z Williams: absolutely, we can bring it back at the next meeting

-LCJ: I would like to see the priority comprehensive list of resurfacing; also important is the streetscape and the manicuring of lawns in certain areas and corridors. I am looking forward a more comprehensive report on what is being done, a report back on the edging, and looking at more comprehensive landscaping as we're resurfacing.
