- -LCJ: the issue becomes you cannot allocate funds through a resolution; that is where greater discussion will be needed; prior to we need to do the due diligence to determine the amount stated is what is needed, which will take a vote independent of the resolution
- V Ernstes: typically you allocate funds through the budget; the resolution could be amended as an intent to include it in the budget in 2022; until you have a budget appropriation item you would need to make that determination. You may want to put out an RFP for this process as well to have an expert assist.
- -LCJ: we could state a study to take place within the content, but eliminate an actual dollar figure; the dollar figure could become a slippery slope; we could have a friendly amendment to that section of the resolution to remove the dollar amount and reflect a study on behalf of DeKalb County Government to move toward a Vision and Transition Plan of 100% Clean Energy and Clean Transportation powering the County's need by 2050. Once we have language relating to development of a RFP that would resolve the issue?
- V Ernstes: ves ma'am
- -Question TT: could we have it be the development of an RFP, that Central Staff could work with me on, and through that process we could move forward with budget recommendations?
- Z Williams: you could do that, or you could provide in the 2022 budget an allocation of x amount toward this effort
- -Question TT: it takes about 6 months to do an RFP process?
- CPO Horner: that is correct; it may take 6 months as it may be complex with providing the proposers enough time to propose
- -TT: the resolution could say we will develop the RFP; let that process play out, and in months we will be a the mid-year stage and we will address that then
- -LCJ: I concur with that; the Green Policy committee may be the place to provide that; comparative studies with other jurisdictions will be helpful, such as the City of Atlanta RFP that was mentioned

- TT: It may be a yearlong community engagement process, so we could amend that to December 1, 2023 rather than 2022. That time period after the RFP process would allow a year and a half to complete the totality of the work
