II. DISCUSSION

Capacity Assurance Banking Credit Program

-Information presented by Maria Houser

Question LCJ: this presentation seems focused on Snapfinger but is this issue not County-wide?

M Houser: We have a model that shows the issue county-wide every model area has developments that are currently pending.

Question LCJ: Can you define what you mean by Community enhancements

M Houser: it incorporates affordable and low income housing, school districts health clinics and opportunity zones as dedicated by the federal Government. It's an opportunity to encourage development

Question TT: Snapfinger was 800 units?

M Houser: that is correct multifamily units and some single family units. Over 80% of request are for housing

Question TT: do you have similar analysis for the other basins? I know time is of the essence what is the logistics will this be reoccurring for PWI?

M Houser: yes and we can forward that information as well. We will be engaging with large developments and try to draft an agreement. We are working with Law to figure out contracting details, specifically if we need any ordinance revision to code 25-177. Now that we are certified with the EPA and EPD we are ready to move quickly.

Question TT: Is this mostly law department work to bring it over the finish line or does Watershed Budget cover it?

V Ernstes: we have developed template contracts and are hoping minimum work will be needed to complete projects

Question JR: are there additional asks outside of the proposed budget?

COO Williams: each of these departments are able to manage with the budget they have. We will provide the handouts and if there are any further questions we will be available

Roads & Drainage

-information presented by Director Peggy Allen & Richard Lemke

Question TT: How long will the Storm Water master plan take to complete

R Lemke: I do not have a set timeline yet we are still trying to compile the data and start the analysis. Once I have a schedule from the consultant I will circulate it

Question TT: in terms of your department is there any capacity to pursue grants that might be available?

P Allen: we regularly apply for grants one of the projects mentioned have federal reimbursement behind it. We apply for grants to help with our floodplain funding

COO Williams: we are always open to new opportunities

Question LCJ: regarding federal funds, does the administration have a formal reply regarding the letter that was sent by congressman Hank Johnson regarding the I-285 and I-20 interchange? it was sent last week.

COO Williams: I am not familiar

LCJ: this was sent from the federal level to GDOT to hold on approval until rail has been extended in DeKalb. IT recognized the locally preferred option of heavy rail but not excluding light rail an other modes or rapid transportation. I'd like us to take a look at it because I don't know the full extent of the impact but it does request a halt to that project.

Question TT: We need to look at what a local match would be for transit. I don't want to be put in a position where we are late to request the federal funds available. Regarding the road striping mentioned in the presentation is there currently a work plan for the road striping?

P Allen: we do have a wait list of roads. Our transportation received state funding for striping. We did 10 miles last year and we are working through our document.

LCJ: we passed the contract for roads striping last year. GDOT has expressed a storage of companies that could stripe roads. We should continue to send those and you are correcting a priority list?

P Allen: you are correct. We are down to one contractor and we utilized that contract fully plus did a change order to extend it. We are responsible for about 2,000 miles or road.

Question JR: We used to do a specific focus on Schools and every year before the new school year the county did work to inspect and refresh school crossings. Do we still prioritize school zones on an annual bias?

P Allen: we used to have an officer assigned to us to help with that project we no longer have that officer but we do prioritize school zones.

Question TT: Does the budget also incorporate reflectors for safety?

P Allen: yes those are line items in the budget, it does get expensive.

TT: I asked Chief Ramos to send over high crash areas, maybe we could prioritize placing reflectors within areas where crashes are taking place

P Allen: we can take a look but as the need grows so the does the demand for products

Question TT: does SPLOST not cover this?

P Allen: it does not

COO Williams: maybe future SPOLST and incorporate sign replacements

LCJ: once a formal recommendation comes back as to what needs to be done we can create a plan on action. It is my understanding roughly 85% of SPLOST is dedicated for roads with the remaining 15% available for CIP
