At that time you can make the presentation, we can take a vote on it and the other items

-JR: do we have a copy of the rate increase proposal? If you could send it to us that would be helpful

-Question RP: we're looking to have this on our BOC agenda for the next Tuesday?

LCJ: we do what we're comfortable with; if we hear it before next week, we would move it to the next phase, but if not we will have the necessary discussions

-Question TT: will part of this be tied to the refinancing of the water and sewer bonds?

*M* Houser: it's part of it; in the agenda item it's the entire financial plan. It's the rate plan, the WFIA loan #2, bond refinancing, a plan as to how we solidify our future for water and sewer infrastructure until 2030. we will be happy to engage
