II. STATUS UPDATE

Flock Camera District Locations

Information provided by Commissioner Terry

TT: I want to open up discussion about the locations, budgetary impact and timeline

COO: I'm envisioning this coming down to budgetary actions in several steps, starting with police top priorities, following with other provided locations in FY24 budget and FY24midyear budget. Ongoing costs will also need to be considered.

Ramos: the top 31 locations would cost \$206,000/2 years, if we do the additional 62 we are looking at \$412,300/2 years. Total amount \$618,450/2 years. If we only look at one year, which includes installation; top 31 locations cost \$113,150/1 year, the additional 62 is \$186,000/1 year all 92 is \$339,450/1 year. It's easier two do two years because of the amount of time needed for the paper work and contact process. Question TT: can you speak to how they work, it provides real time data?

Ramos: it gives us an alert when it captures a flag plate.

Question TT: is it helpful after the fact?

Ramos: yes historically information is helpful. Additional context provided.

Question SB: Is the list close, could we include additional locations.

Ramos: I'd like to start with the 31 and continuously work on the list.

TT: If we can start with the 31 priority locations now, Could we develop a process for the next phases between now and March 1st budget?

Ramos: We can move forward on the 31 priority locations now. If we know the list for the next phase we can provided that to FLOCK and maybe they scout the locations early. They typically inspect to confirm a location is conducive to FLOCK needs.

TT: Yes to commissioner Bradshaw, We want to keep this conversation into the next budget year.

Ouestion TT: you don't need our approval to start with the first 31 locations now?

COO: no.

Question MDJ: I'd like to see the first 31 mapped out.

Ramos: Ramos: we can provide the locations on a map for you to review, color codes as they are on the list and break it up to compare and provide a holistically view.

Question TT: COO, would like the committee to forward the second round of cameras now to be considered in the FY24 budget?

COO: yes it would be helpful to go ahead and gather what commissioners would like to see in the budget, it's helpful

SB: Motion to accept and forward the recommended locations to the administration to start the top priority areas now and the second phase to be considered in the FY2024 budget. With a return to committee to codify exact locations for FY2024
