GIS Update

Presentation provided by Stacy Grear, Director GIS

RP: What is the process for foreclosures?

Grear: We secure the documentation. If the property changes owner, we update our systems. This occurs when we receive the deed.

RP: What is the turnaround time?

Grear: Once it's scanned in, about a week or two

Q NM: Can you speak to why there has been a decline in foreclosures?

Grear: There have been many squatters in the past, which is my first thought. The legislature passed updated requirements for proof of ID and other identifiers, which helped us a lot.

QLB: Are these new foreclosures or all active?

Grear: No, these are new each year

Q LB: You are showing a significant increase in property sales for 2025; have we adjusted for inflation? I would like to know if we are selling more properties or if they are more expensive.

Grear: The volume is pretty steady; this increase for 2025 is because a particular property is being sold.

Q NM: What if anything, are you all working to approve, or any room for growth?

Grear: outreach and education. One thing we are considering starting is a GIS Steering Committee.

Q TT: I have a request for GIS - can we get an overlay map for SPLOST I & II so we can see clearly where the money is being spent. Additional details provided.

Grear: Yes, that's something we can work on.

Q MLS: Where do you see the GIS department in the next 3-5 years, including the use of AI

Grear: We need to expand our infrastructure to prepare for more AI use. I also want us to be more active in public safety and emergency response too. Additional details provided.
