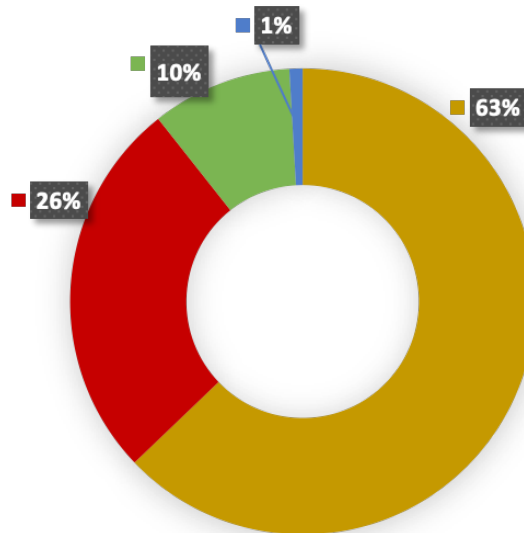

Through 2024, an estimated \$388 million will be invested in capital improvements throughout unincorporated DeKalb. SPLOST is slated to fund a broad variety of projects from road repaving and park upgrades to new public safety equipment and library improvements.

- Above all, be ready to be responsive and responsible in taking advantage of available SPLOST opportunities





GETTING INVOLVED

SPLOST projects may be a new opportunity in DeKalb, but the process for participating as a vendor follows the County's normal procurement policies. Get started in just four easy steps:



STEP 1: Attend DeKalb's "How to Do Business Clinics" to learn more about becoming a supplier and get help with iSupplier registration and LSBE applications. The clinics are

held the second Friday of each month through October.



STEP 2: Become a registered vendor with the County through iSupplier at www.dekalbcountyga.gov/isupplier.



STEP 3: Access solicitations for Invitations to Bid (ITB), Requests for Proposals (RFP) and instructions on submitting bids at www.dekalbcountyga.gov/dobusiness.

Information regarding bid opportunities is also available at www.dekalbcountyga.gov/formalbids. Other major sources are the *Champion* newspaper at DeKalbLegalNotices.com and the Georgia Procurement Registry at doas.ga.gov and DCTV-23, the County's cable channel.



STEP 4: Attend the Mandatory Prime DeKalb First (LSBE) meeting listed for interested solicitations found on the Purchasing and Contracting website at www.dekalbcountyga.gov/formalbids.

The meetings are held Wednesdays from 10 to 11 a.m., and 2 to 3 p.m., in the Main Conference Room-B at DeKalb Watershed Management, 4572 Memorial Dr., Decatur, GA 30032. 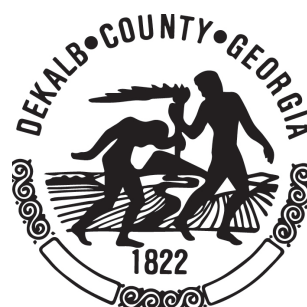
